Dear Examining Authority,

I am writing as an interested party opposing the application by Scottish Power for permission to construct a transformer station at Friston (and the construction of cabling to bring power ashore through an area of outstanding natural beauty).

I have quoted all the references I can find and this letter is intended for both East Anglia One North and East Anglia Two.

As I am 78 years old I hope you will forgive me for not fully understanding the mountains of paperwork being generated by these applications.

I, together with my wife, have made oral representations at the open floor hearings and I am not going to repeat myself. Indeed, I adopt the intelligent and informed representations made by other individuals and bodies.

Both for myself and my wife, as well as on behalf of St. Mary the Virgin parish church [REDACTED] I object in the strongest terms to these applications in their present form.

By the time I first heard of these proposals (and I know I am not alone in this), SPR had progressed these applications quite far and they have not moved their position in any meaningful way despite the very serious objections made by so many people and organisations (supported by our MP).

While neither my wife nor I has any objection to the development of offshore wind turbines in an effort to provide electrical power for the National Grid, these proposals to bring this onshore and connect it to the grid have not been properly thought through.

I therefore believe that the present onshore infrastructure plan is

rejected so that other locations may be properly considered.
