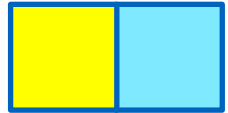

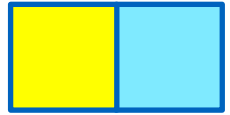


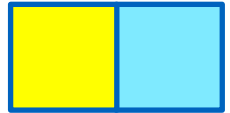

1	<p>Appendix 3 of the onshore WSI (Headland Archaeology) Historic England have previously submitted comments with regards to the Appendix 3 of the revised WSI (submitted at Deadline 3). Following a reassessment of the WSI submitted for Deadline 6 we can confirm that our previous comments have not been addressed . We would appreciate it if the applicant was able to clarify these matters or confirm when changes would be addressed.</p>	<p>The Applicants responded to this point at Deadline 6 in REP6-028. However, please see below.</p> <p>In Section 2.7 of Historic England's Written Representation (REP1-143) and within Historic England's Deadline 5 Submission (REP5-073) there are three additions requested to Appendix 3 of the Outline Written Scheme of Investigation (Iterations including: APP-582; REP3-026; REP6-005). These additions are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>“An outline of the environmental sampling strategy has been provided in Section 7.5, stating that a number of different types of samples will be considered where appropriate, including the collection of monolith and specialist samples to assess plant remains, pollen, waterlogged wood etc. which is good to see. It is also stated that 40-60L samples will be collected from deposits such as occupation and midden deposits, and ditch and pit fills. It is however, important at the evaluation stage to collect samples from all types of deposits that are relevant to the aims of the sampling strategy, as many classes of environmental material are not visible to the naked eye, such as chaff fragments and small weed seeds (HE 2011, p9). The samples should also be processed in a timely manner to ensure that the archaeological remains are stable. We recommend this section is amended to cover this point;</i> • <i>Section 7.11 states that all artefacts will be washed, but it should be noted that some remains, such as pottery vessels where organic residues are preserved, should be excluded from this. Washing may remove delicate archaeological evidence, which may provide information about what was stored in a vessel. We recommend this section is amended to include this point; and</i>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Section 9.1 discusses the post-excavation work. It is not clear if any of the samples will be processed to inform the interim report, as it is stated that the full analysis of all finds and environmental samples will take place at the earliest time after the interim report has been completed. The evaluation of environmental samples will contribute to the understanding of the potential and significance of the archaeological resource, as stated in the Historic England document, 'Environmental Archaeology' (2011). We would therefore recommend that samples assessed as part of the evaluation stage of works and the WSI is amended accordingly." <p>Although the Applicants note these comments, trial trenching began in August 2019, and completed in December 2019. Therefore, the Applicants deem any updates to Appendix 3 at this point redundant as they would have to be made retrospectively and would have no material influence on the work already undertaken and conclusions already drawn, hence why these updates have not been made.</p>
