Dear Sir,

I'm writing once again to oppose the proposed siting of Scottish Powers substations at Friston.

I have watched ALL of the on line hearings which have been taking place since October 2020 and listened to the well founded objections and cannot understand how these disruptive plans could possibly be

granted the go ahead when there is a large brownfield site at Bramford with a substation already in existence and extra space available to accommodate Scottish Power's needs.

The arguments against these plans include the serious problems of flooding, loss of countryside including ancient footpaths, tourism in this area including Aldeburgh and Snape , disruption of traffic, noise and light pollution,

the health of the people of Friston and all those along the proposed link from Thorpness, the threat to wildlife and the AONB and National Grid's future plans to give permission to eight other wind farms for their substations.

All these objections have been expressed far more eloquently than I am able to do here but please I implore you to oppose these far damaging plans by Scottish Power.
