Sirs

It is with great dismay that I received emails to explain that Scottish Power Renewables have been granted 3 months extension to the enquiry, extending the Examination to 6 July 2021.

I object to the extension of the Examinations on the grounds that it is procedurally unfair.

SEAS, like other local groups, have limited human and financial resources. To meet the gruelling schedule of hearings they, in effect, emptied the bank accounts to pay for experts and counsel and cancelled or deferred commitments. They will be severely hampered in their ability to participate further in this inquiry. Some groups and individuals may not be able to participate at all. In this context, Scottish Power Renewables (SPR) has unlimited financial resources and any extension can and will be funded commensurately. Added to this the Sizewell inquiry has now commenced and many of those involved in this Examination will now be involved in the Sizewell examination. Thus further increasing the strain on resources. Finally, the overwhelming impression we are left with is that the extension benefits SPR by giving them an unfair chance to plug the multitude of gaps that exist in its evidence. SPR has had more than ample opportunity to adduce evidence on all matters.
