1	3.17.1 Suffolk Coast DMO 'The Energy Coast' Report 2019 The Applicants consider the stimuli used in the above report were used out of context and did not provide adequate information about the projects [REP7-034]. Respond to the above, should you wish to do so.	The Suffolk Cost DMO understands that SPR is critical of the stimuli used in the survey. The DMO used its best endeavours to make sure that the report was independent and used information that were drawn from SPR's own materials. SPR had the opportunity to design an alternative study but chose not to do so.	The Applicants maintain their position from REP7-034 ExA Q2 2.17.4 on the stimuli. Further detail is provided in section 3.2 of the Applicants' Written Summary of Oral Case (ISH5) (REP5-029).		
2	3.17.2 Tourism Fund The ExAs note that the Applicants have committed to providing £150,000 to be paid to the Suffolk Community Foundation to market the area during the construction period of the projects [REP9-041]. The ExAs note that the Applicants do not consider that the Projects will have significant impacts upon visitor perception during construction and direct impacts which could affect visitors already present in the area will be mitigated to not significant levels but that despite this they have committed to the Tourism Fund [REP9-009].
