I write one again regarding this project and call for the Examining Authorities to recommend to the Secretary of State a 'split decision' so that -

1. The offshore turbines are recommended for consent.
2. The onshore infrastructure is rejected in favour of full consideration of better locations for this infrastructure where the multiple adverse impacts are minimised at a brownfield or industrial site.

I firmly believe that the Applicant's proposals should adhere to the emerging government policy of greater offshore co-ordination to protect our environment - which we understand has been backed at the highest level in Parliament recently. It follows logically from this that the onshore aspects of these projects must be rejected in favour of a Grid connection which offers the capacity to integrate multiple projects without having a devastating impact on local communities and also precious and protected landscapes. We need joined-up thinking on the onshore aspects to protect our countryside.
