Dear Sirs

Further to my earlier submissions under the above personal references I wish to reiterate my support for the Examining Authorities to recommend to the Secretary of State a 'split decision' so that:

1. The offshore turbines are recommended for consent.
2. The onshore infrastructure is rejected in favour of full consideration of better locations for this infrastructure where the adverse impacts are minimised at a brownfield or industrialised site.

This Split decision proposal is supported by our local MP Therese Coffey and has the support of many in the local area. The building of the on shore infrastructure for this project at Friston and the consequential massive disruption to the thriving local tourist based economy would be a very short sighted ill considered solution to a problem that has many other less damaging alternative solutions. These alternative on shoring options should be given due consideration before making a final decision. But this delay should not be cause to delay the decision about building the offshore turbines.

The arguments for this split decision solution have been excellently more fully articulated by SEAS and I fully endorse them.
