East Anglia ONE North project	The proposed project consisting of up to 67 wind turbines, up to four offshore electrical platforms, up to one construction, operation and maintenance platform, inter-array cables, platform link cables, up to one operational meteorological mast, up to two offshore export cables, fibre optic cables, landfall infrastructure, onshore cables and ducts, onshore substation, and National Grid infrastructure.
East Anglia ONE North windfarm site	The offshore area within which wind turbines and offshore platforms will be located.
East Anglia TWO project	The proposed project consisting of up to 75 wind turbines, up to four offshore electrical platforms, up to one construction, operation and maintenance platform, inter-array cables, platform link cables, up to one operational meteorological mast, up to two offshore export cables, fibre optic cables, landfall infrastructure, onshore cables and ducts, onshore substation, and National Grid infrastructure.
East Anglia TWO windfarm site	The offshore area within which wind turbines and offshore platforms will be located.
National Grid infrastructure	A National Grid substation, cable sealing end compounds, cable sealing end (with circuit breaker) compound, underground cabling and National Grid overhead line realignment works to facilitate connection to the national electricity grid, all of which will be consented as part of the proposed East Anglia TWO / East Anglia ONE North project Development Consent Order but will be National Grid owned assets.
National Grid substation	The substation (including all of the electrical equipment within it) necessary to connect the electricity generated by the proposed East Anglia TWO / East Anglia ONE North project to the national electricity grid which will be owned by National Grid but is being consented as part of the proposed East Anglia TWO / East Anglia ONE North project Development Consent Order.
National Grid substation location	The proposed location of the National Grid substation.

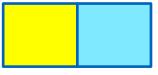

PINS REF The Applicants disagree with the views of Mr Cotter in respect to their regard to 20023069 & 20023070 Deadline 12 Submission, 28 June. the significance of the track to Little Moor Farm and refer to the following documents where this has been covered: Clarification Note - Archaeology I take issue with SPR's answer to your question ExQs3. 3.8.4. and Cultural Heritage (REP1-021) and EA1N&EA2 Applicants' Comments The track between Friston and Little Moor farm has existed for 500 on Martin Cotter's Deadline 11 Submissions (REP12-054). plus years. The track linked Friston to the homestead of eight occupied properties at Little Moor Farm which was known as Hunts Farm Settlement, and the moated parsonage. This track is there because of the homestead so therefore is of massive significance to the existing properties heritage and the foundations of the other properties, which are still visible in the ground. My deeds still show easements for access to Little Moor along the track from Friston. SPR's dismissal of it importance shows their complete disregard for our countries history. They are only interested in bulldozing their project through and their only driver is cost. They are not a sustainable green developer as they claim; in fact, this is turning into "Very Dirty Wind". They are a profitmaking conglomerate with zero conscience. As discussed in the Applicants' <i>Outline Public Rights of Way (PRoW) Strategy</i> (AS-116), PRoW E-354/006/0 requires a 693m section to be permanently stopped-up to allow the construction and operation of the onshore substation and National Grid infrastructure. An expanded PRoW network will be provided around the onshore substation and National Grid infrastructure location to mitigate the loss of the PRoW; the routing of which will be set out in the DCO unless otherwise agreed with the relevant highway authority.

	This plan shows the new diverted PROW coming through Laurel Covet, North to Fareacres then West across the field to my boundary halfway down my field. The new route then proceeds south round the perimeter of my field then west across the southern boundary of High House Farm then joins up with the existing PROW which carries on south to Friston.I do not believe this detour around the southern third of my property is required. The new PROW should terminate at my field boundary after coming across from Fareacres then carry on North on the existing PROW. This change increases intrusion on my property boundary line for another third of my property which I don't want. This shortcut has never existed and is not required as once my field boundary is arrived at the public should carry on north on the track that has existed for 500 years not circumnavigate the southern half of my field. Can you please raise this with SPR.
