The 2nd November letter from the Secretary of State (BEIS), The Rt Hon Kwasi Kwarteng MP, requested more information on certain aspects of the Planning Examinations.

More recently his letter of clarification confirmed that the Environment Agency should consider ALL Interested Parties representations on Flood Events.

I am writing to express my concern and outrage that the impact on our beautiful medieval village will be significant and will change the village and the area forever.

As a village that already has significant flooding I am astounded why the proposals are not proposed to alleviate a 1 in 100 year storm as we appear to have has a number of these recently which leads me to believe the impact of the proposed infrastructure will impact our village life forever and increase the likelihood of flooding to our village.

In addition to this I would like to stress the issues regarding the following which to date I do not believe have been mitigated or eradicated to any degree of residents satisfaction in any of the proposals:

1. the impact of light pollution in a rural and dark skies area
2. the impact to the tourism industry in this area of the coastline as being a premier UK holiday destination.
3. the devastation to our unique flora and fauna that we will loose forever.

But the biggest issue being the complete lack of strategy and joined up approach from the energy companies in terms of a viable uk wide plan rather than the feeding frenzy of applications we are seeing come through that will just keep coming.

It makes me so sad to think of what we are doing to future generations and to our precious countryside

My CALL TO ACTION is for the Secretary of State to recommend a 'split decision' so that:

◆ 1. The offshore turbines are recommended for consent.

◆ 2. The onshore infrastructure is rejected in favour of full consideration of better locations for this infrastructure where the adverse impacts are minimised at a brownfield or industrialised site.
