I find it interesting and somewhat puzzling that the developer has not named the nearest property (Ivy Todd Farm) to the Vanguard (and Boreas) onshore substation at Necton as a suggested location for a site visit.

I note that there does not appear to be a photo-montage showing the worst case scenario from either Ivy Todd Farm or Wood Farm. If I am mistaken in this kindly direct me to the said montages. If I am correct I would like the developer to be asked why this is the case.

It would appear the developer is being disingenuous in their other choices, such as 'Location 8' (St.Andrews Lane) which it seems has been carefully chosen, laying behind a natural rise in the ground and whilst the National Grid substation extension may be seen from there, to get an idea of the impact of the substations on the residents of St.Andrews Lane you would need to see the view from the rear gardens further down the lane (on the north-east side of the road) and of course from their rear upper floors where they will all see the substations.
