1.0 Summary

Highways England (HE) have been involved with numbers of consultation meetings and communications with the Transport Team and/or their consultant from the Norfolk Vanguard project. The following Table shows the remaining Traffic and Transportation tasks recently agreed or under discussion with the applicant/representative after the last Issue Specific Hearing (ISH4) held on 27 March 2019.

As we understand it, there are still a few items which are in discussion or still waiting to be reviewed by either of us Highways England or Norfolk Vanguard project team. These include: -

1.0 Statement of Common Ground (SoCG)- dated 14 March 2019

There are still a few items which are in discussion or still waiting to be reviewed by either of us (Highways England or Norfolk Vanguard project team).

2.0 A47 Cable Crossing Access (North-West of Scarning) Technical Note (CACTN)

In the Statement of Common Ground (dated 13 March 2019), we identified issues with the A47 junctions at Scarning which will be used by vehicles accessing the A47 cable crossing work sites via access points AC160 and AC161. These included: DMRB compliance, detailed junction layout plans, swept paths of Heavy Goods Vehicles (HGVs), collision data analysis, existing traffic flows, traffic management arrangements with traffic restrictions, etc.

The Norfolk Vanguard project team has submitted concept drawings to us (HE). We have made informal comments on these and anticipate that these issues will be addressed in the forthcoming A47 Cable Crossing Access Technical Note (CCATN).

Once the CCATN is received and commented on, we expect to be in a position to sign a SOCG which indicates that this issue has been resolved.

3.0 Substation Access Clarification Technical Note (SACTN)- dated 12 March 2019

Highways England is content, in principle, that the issues raised in AECOM Briefing Notes 04 and 06 have been addressed in a satisfactory way.

Following an initial review on our behalf by AECOM, a number of items requiring clarification were identified, together with a number of missing drawings. The Norfolk Vanguard Transport consultant team forwarded three additional drawings by email on 3 April 2019, and an updated SACTN on 5 April. We are currently in the process of finalising our response to this material. We are hoping to be able to make a formal response within the next few days.

4.0 A47 Sensitive Junctions 1-4

We have provided feedback (BN05, dated February 2019) and are generally content with the assessment. Two critical matters raised both to be resolved in the revised Outline TMP (as below):

- a. The impact of wind farm construction on both Junctions 1 (A47 Gapton Hall) and 2 (A47 Vauxhall) should be controlled through the Construction Traffic Management Plan (CTMP), which should aim to minimise the number of additional vehicles using this junction during peak periods, for example using an hour of working restriction.
- b. At junction 4 (A47 Acle), consideration should be given to the use of variable message signifying aimed at alerting westbound drivers on the A47 of the risk of excessive queues at this junction whilst they are still on the Acle Straight.

The Norfolk Vanguard Project team has indicated that this will be done.

In addition to the above Table (list of items) shown earlier, within the Traffic and Transport topic, the following documents would be required, from the Norfolk Vanguard project team in due course, later in the process.

- A. Detailed Traffic Management Plan (TMP) & Access Management Plan (AMP): We understand that these documents will be a requirement of the DCO. We understand that the Outline TMP will be updated and submitted to the examination late in the process, when all matters are resolved. Highways England is content with this approach.
- B. Code of Construction Practice (CoCP): Highways England understand that a detailed CoCP will be a requirement of the DCO. We understand that the Outline CoCP will be updated and submitted to the examination late in the process, when all matters are resolved. Highways England is content with this approach.

5.0 Conclusion

Highways England is content with the general methodology used to inform the traffic and transport impacts of the proposals on the Strategic Road Network (SRN). There are no specific points to raise which would affect the outcomes of the assessment or its associated mitigation.

Subject to a satisfactory A47 Cable Crossing Access Technical Note (CCATN) being received, Highways England anticipate being able to sign a final Statement of Common Ground at Deadline 7 indicating that we are content with the access arrangements, mitigation proposals and residual impacts from the Norfolk Vanguard Offshore Wind Farm on the Strategic Road Network.
