At the OFH on Monday 28th January, and in response to a comment made regarding the lack of attendance at the hearing, the Applicant confirmed that the hearing had been advertised in accordance with Regulation 13 of the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010. A number of the parish councillors present at the hearing commented that the Applicant had not contacted them to request that a notice be put on the parish council notice board in their area.

Notice was publicised in the following local papers, as well as Fishing News and the Lloyds List.

In addition to the newspaper notices, 24 site notices were posted at prominent locations along the 55km onshore route. These included:-

- · Weybourne beach car park
- Intersections with Public Rights of Way, including Marriott's Way and near major HDD crossings
- Where the export cable passes built up centres for example intersections of footpaths near Corpustry.
- · Crossing point with Norfolk Vanguard
- Land near Booton Common
- Near permanent above ground works such as the HVAC Booster Station, HVDC Converter/HVAC Substation and Norwich Main National Grid Substation.
- Main Construction Compound (at the intersection with The Street at Oulton)

As you can see on the attached plans, significantly more notices were erected than the 5km intervals required in the Regulations.

However, notices for the hearings were not issued by the Applicant to each Parish Council (with a request to post hard copies on any public notice board if so maintained by the Parish Council). Whilst the Applicant considers that anyone who wanted to participate in the open floor hearing was likely to have seen one of the site notices or the newspaper notice, or was already registered as an Interested Party, the Applicant

accepts that it could be argued that Regulation 13(6)(b) has not been properly complied with.

If the ExA deem necessary – the Applicant would welcome holding a third open floor hearing in case any member of the public wishes to make representations. If a further OFH is held, the Applicant will give notice of the event by way of newspaper adverts, site notices and issue a copy to all parish councils along the route. As we discussed this week, a further OFH could be held in the evening after the accompanied site inspection scheduled for 5 March 2019.

We apologise for any inconvenience this issue has caused.
