The Applicant's Response to Secretary of State's Consultation 2

Dear Mr Leigh

We are pleased to enclose a response from Orsted Hornsea Project Three (UK) Limited ("the Applicant") to the Secretary of State's correspondence dated 27 September 2019 and 17 December 2019 ("the Consultation"), required for submission today, Friday 14 February 2020. A full list of documents provided in response to the Consultation is provided below under "Consultation Deliverables".

Post Examination, the Applicant has continued to vigorously re-appraise the envelope for Hornsea Three and has committed to further, material reductions to the maximum design scenario (MDS) and additional mitigation for Hornsea Three where feasible (**Appendix 4** to the Applicant's Response), including:

- Decrease in maximum number of turbines from 300 to 231.
- Increase in minimum rotor tip height of turbines from 34.97m above LAT/33.17 above MSL¹ to 41.8m above LAT/40m above MSL.
- Decrease in total rotor swept area from 9km² to 8.8km².
- Removal of all infrastructure from Markham's Triangle Marine Conservation Zone (MCZ) (also referenced in Appendix 5 to the Applicant's response is an updated MCZ Assessment).
- Reduction in cable rock protection within European designated sites from 10% of length of each cable within the designated site to 6%.
- Reduction in cable rock protection within the Cromer Shoal Chalk Beds MCZ from 10% of length of each cable within the site to 7%.

These refinements have led to substantial reductions in the impacts to the European designated sites and MCZs referred to in the Secretary of State's Consultation. This is documented in **Appendix 1, 2, 3 and 4** to the Applicant's Response.

The Applicant remains confident of its position that Hornsea Three, on the basis of the MDS set out during the Examination, would not give rise to any adverse effect

on a European designated site nor would it have a significant risk of hindering the achievement of the conservation objectives stated for any MCZ, and therefore, the Applicant's Response to the Secretary of State's Consultation is made without prejudice.

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Should the Secretary of State conclude an adverse effect on integrity (AEOI), enclosed with this letter is the necessary information to support a clear and overriding Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA) derogation case for Hornsea Three, which could be relied upon by the Secretary of State if required (**Appendix 1 and 2** to the Applicant's Response). Similarly, the Applicant has provided the Secretary of State with the necessary information to support an MCZ derogation case fulfilling the requirements of the condition in section 126(7) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009 relating to MCZs if required (**Appendix 3** to the Applicant's Response).

In accordance with the Secretary of State's Consultation request, in preparing its response the Applicant has consulted openly and transparently with the key stakeholders, specifically Natural England and the Marine Management Organisation, which has been welcomed by the key stakeholders. The Applicant has shared information on a without prejudice basis, to provide parties with the opportunity to consider and contribute towards the development of the HRA and MCZ Derogation Cases for Hornsea Three. A Record of Consultation is set out in **Appendix 8** to the Applicant's Response.

In order to deliver 40GW of offshore wind by 2030, and at least 75GW by 2050 (as per the Committee on Climate Change's recommendation) to meet the UK's long-term net zero commitments, the UK needs to urgently deploy significant volumes of large-scale, low carbon generation. Hornsea Three can deliver in the order of 2.4GW of offshore wind in the 2020s.

The Applicant is confident, should the Secretary of State conclude an AEOI, that the HRA and MCZ Derogation Cases submitted provides the necessary information to support a clear and overriding case for Hornsea Three.
