Hornsea Three is the third development proposed within the former Hornsea Zone, and it comprises up to 231 offshore wind turbines together with associated offshore and onshore infrastructure and all associated development. Hornsea Three is located within the former Hornsea Zone, to the east of Hornsea Project One and Hornsea Project Two. It is located 121 km off the Norfolk coast and 160 km off the Yorkshire coast, and covers an area of approximately 696 square kilometres.

The deadline date for all representations to be received by the Secretary of State under regulation 17(3) was 11.59pm on 16th April 2020.
