HSE is a commonly used acronym for the Health and Safety Executive, as well as for the term 'health, safety and environmental'. To avoid confusion, could the Applicant please select which term they wish to use the acronym for, and write the other term out in full. HSE has no other comment.

## **HSE Response**

Our suggested wording would be:

30. "No phase of the proposed development shall come into operation until health and safety risks have been addressed by the employer as required under the Health and Safety at Work, etc Act 1974 and its relevant

statutory provisions (RSPs). In particular, the requirements under the management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations to identifying hazards, prepare a suitable and sufficient risk assessment for the proposed activities and taking appropriate measures to manage and control the risks".

HSE is concerned with planning authorities asking for such assessments to be submitted to them – "Such an assessment should be submitted and approved by the relevant planning authority". What will happen to these assessments once submitted? HSE has no role in examining such assessments prior to operations commencing.
