(2) The term "commence" as used in requirement 13(1) includes any site preparation works. (3) Where a European-protected species is shown to be present, the phase of authorised development must not begin until, after consultation with Natural England and the relevant planning authority, a scheme of protection and mitigation measures has been submitted to and approved by the relevant planning authority. (4) The authorised development must be carried out in accordance with the approved scheme. (5) In this Requirement, "European-protected species" has the same meaning as refers to any species defined as a European Protected Species in regulations 42 and 46 of the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017 or any species to which Part I and Schedule 5 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 applies.
