I have lived in Cawston for over 30 years and our house is located on the B1145 towards the centre of the village, just down from the village store. There has been a huge increase in traffic movement over these years with the Cawston Winery lorries and, in the season, lorries fully laden with sugar beet. I can tell you that sitting in my house, when a fully laden 38-tonner passes, you can feel the vibrations through the ground. Additionally, there has been a proportional increase in car traffic, as it is the main village link road from North Walsham to King's Lynn.

For you to propose that you intend to send 100s more HGVs through our village over a long protracted period is very short-sighted, damaging to our environment and shows that you do have a blatant disregard for our local community, including our school children who transit this very busy road.

You have already had your surveyors in the village to scope your proposal, can they not see the huge problems this would cause?
