Thank you for this. I am objecting to this proposal.

DS Smith cannot be trusted. They have a long record of putting in applications and then a few months later making massive alterations to them. This is yet another example.

The proposed height of the turbine building will be some 15' higher than their original plan. This will have a detrimental affect on the views from the country park. It will also increase light pollution from the mill site. They should, and in my opinion did know this would be the actual height of the new building at the time of the exhibition locally held but again in my opinion they deliberately chose to mislead local residents and yourselves. Something they have a long and dishonourable record in doing.

The original plan for the waste incinerator currently being built was that it would provide energy for the mill, This morphed into a massive waste incinerator which will bring another 48000 HGV movements a year to the local area. They were dishonest over that and I feel they are being dishonest over this too.

DS Smith frequently breach their environment agency operating licence, this will agravate the problems of noise.

There are not 400 people working on the mill site, the actual figure is nearer to 270 again DS Smith are trying to mislead.

DS Smith are already in company with Wheelabrator to build a waste incinerator next to the mill site, they are planning another, they cannot possibly need all this steam, Frequently it is released to the atmosphere.

I originally had no real objection to the replacement of an existing facility but this is not a replacement, It is a completely new installation which bears no relation to what it is supposed to be replacing and will be much larger.

It will have a negative affect on local house prices.

It will cause further considerable congestion on the A249 at the junction with Swale Way.

DS Smith are a leading cause of producing packaging which will need recycling or incinerating. This will encourage more packaging to be produced which in turn will lead to more rubbish being produced...

The simple fact is I do not trust the company at all, I do not feel they have been honest with local people and yourselves and I hope their application is turned down,
