Comment on MMO's Deadline 3 submission

At paragraph 1.2.1 of the Deadline 3 submission the MMO has suggested that a potential wildlife license for Tentacled Lagoon Worm should be included in the Other Consents and Licenses Statement. The applicant has consulted with the MMO's conservation team to set out the evidence that Tentacled Lagoon Worm are not present at this location and therefore there is no expectation that Tentacled Lagoon Worm would be impacted or a license application will be required. The MMO has advised that it remains the developer's responsibility to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended) and notes that there is in any event no provision for licences to be granted for the purpose of general development work. The Other Consents and Licenses Statement has therefore not been changed.
