

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1 Notices for Statutory Publicity

1.1 Introduction

- 1.1.1 Cory Environmental Holdings Limited (trading as Cory Riverside Energy (Cory) or "the Applicant") is applying to the Secretary of State under the Planning Act 2008 (PA 2008) for powers to construct, operate and maintain an integrated Energy Park, to be known as Riverside Energy Park (REP). The principal elements of REP comprise complementary energy generating development and an associated Electrical Connection (together referred to as the 'Proposed Development'). As the generating capacity of REP will be in excess of 50 MWe it is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP) under Sections 14 and 15 of the PA 2008 and therefore requires a Development Consent Order (DCO) to authorise its construction and operation.
- 1.1.2 The REP site would be located adjacent to an existing Energy Recovery Facility (ERF) operated by Cory (referred to as Riverside Resource Recovery Facility (RRRF)) situated at Norman Road in Belvedere within the London Borough of Bexley (LBB). The underground Electrical Connection would run from the REP site and terminate at the Littlebrook substation in Dartford. The Works Plans (**Document Reference 2.5**) show the location and Order Limits of the Proposed Development.
- 1.1.3 This document has been provided in support of the REP DCO Application; it provides copies of the notices that have been published prior to the submission of the DCO Application in accordance with Section 47 and Section 48 of the PA 2008 and The Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 (as amended).
- 1.1.4 **Table 1.1** provides a list of the newspapers in which the notices have been published and the dates of publication. **Section 2** of this document provides copies of those notices.
- 1.1.5 Further information relating the pre-application publicity and consultation is provided in the Consultation Report (**Document Reference 5.1**).

- Road

The primary components of the Riverside Energy Park, with a nominal rated electrical output of up to 96 MWe, would comprise

- an Energy Recovery Facility (ERF);
- an Anaerobic Digestion facility: a Solar Photovoltaic Installation

 Battery Storage; and
 Enabling infrastructure for Combined Heat and Power to the site boundary to provide for potential future local district heating pipe connection.

The Proposed Application will also seek authorisation for the compulsory acquisition of interest in and rights over land, the temporary use of land and the overriding of easements and other rights.

The Proposed Development is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructu. Project ('NSIP') under the 2008 Act which means that a DCO is required to authorise the construction, operation and maintenance of it.

The Applicant has prepared a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) in respect of the Proposed Application which can be inspected at the times and places set out below.

The Applicant is required under section 47 of the 2008 Act to consult the local community about the Proposed Application in accordance with the SoCC. The SoCC explains how the Applicant will consult the local community about the Proposed Application and includes details about consultation events, information available, and how to get involved. The consultation set out in the SoCC will take place between 18th June 2018 and 30th July 2018.

A2 TRUNK ROAD – NEAR NORTHFLEET TEMPORARY TRAFFIC RESTRICTIONS

Notice is hereby given that Highways England Company Limited has made an Order on the A2 Trunk Road in the County of Kent, under Section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 because works are proposed to be executed on the road.

Simple rules that can cut maternal deaths in Indian villages

The message is written on a poster, hung between trees that offer shade but little relief from the blazing sun. It spells out what has been achieved in this rural Indian village: "We no longer die in childbirth."

For the women of Purabgaon, in the Amethi district of Uttar Pradesh, expectations had always been clear. Get married young, then have backto-back pregnancies. Those babies would be delivered in unsanitary conditions at home by a *dai*, a village midwife with no training and many superstitions.

"Even if a woman was taken to hospital for the birth, half an hour later she would be bundled home to do the chores, feed the cattle and cook," said Gulab Yadav, a project manager in Amethi for Save a Mother.

The maternal mortality rate in Amethi has been one of the highest in the world - 451 deaths per 100,000 live births, according to a 2008 government survey.

Save a Mother aims to educate rural women about pregnancy, nutrition, immunisation, delivery and care of the child. "We told them to delay having the first baby and leave a three-year gap between pregnancies to keep mother and child safe and healthy. And they understand that delivery in hospital is safest because complications such as heavy bleeding can be treated," said Gita Gupta, a Save a Mother team leader.

Gupta leads a group of 20 female

"change agents" in Purabgaon. Each of the 360 villages in Amethi covered by the scheme has 20 agents - local women trained to educate others.

Gupta sometimes changes the lyrics of romantic folk songs to refer to iron supplements, intrauterine devices and breastfeeding. "They find it easier to remember what I've told them if they sing it," she said.

Starting with 20 villages in Amethi 10 years ago, Save a Mother has expanded to 1,100 villages in the states of Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana. The maternal mortality rate in those villages has been reduced by 90% and infant mortality by 60%.

Last year in Purabgaon, not a single mother died in childbirth. Nationwide there are five maternal deaths in childbirth every hour, but the mortality rate has been falling steadily, from 280 per 100,000 live births in 2005 to 174 in 2015 and 130 in 2016.

Shiban Ganju, a Chicago-based doctor, founded Save a Mother after a visit to rural Uttar Pradesh. "As a physician I knew [the high mortality rate] could be solved by a dedicated group working with the community," he said.

He had learned two significant things. Firstly, that changing social behaviour is the most effective and least expensive way to reduce the impact of disease. And secondly, that the Indian government should increase its public health spending from the current 1.1% of GDP - one of the lowest proportions in the world - to 2.5%.

Some of the older women in Purabgaon talked candidly about the relentless pressure they were put under to give birth. "Ihad five children in quick succession, my mother-in-law kept saying she wanted a grandson. Then I married off my eldest daughter at 15," said Urmila Devi. "I know


