Having considered the proposals on the basis of the information available the Council would request that the following points be taken into consideration.

Principle

It is noted that in waste planning terms the development has the potential to deliver new and more sustainable waste capacity in the South–East London subregion.

Possible Impacts on LB Bromley

It is not anticipated that the proposals would give rise to a significant impact on the operation of the road network within the Borough either in the construction or operational phase, based on the available information.

The Council would request that subsequent re-modelling of the proposals consider any likely impacts on air quality in Bromley, particularly on Bromley's Air Quality Management Area, especially to the two Focus Areas, and that construction and management & transport logistic plans identify likely traffic routing through nearby London Boroughs, including Bromley, in order to identify the extent of traffic impacts in general and on air quality in particular, along transport corridors. Where traffic impacts are indicated along transport corridors through Bromley, the Council would seek funding to monitor air quality in these areas, starting with

baseline determination (pre-development), through the construction, development, and commissioning phases, and into the post-commissioning operational phase in order to prove the modelling assumptions, and to identify actual impacts on air quality that can be used to inform the Council's Air Quality Action Plan.

Conclusion

The Council would request that the above mentioned points are taken into consideration.
