New Shetland midwater trawler Adenia named in Spain

The new Whalsay-owned 69.9m midwater trawler Adenia LK 199 was christened at Bilbao on the last Saturday of July, after being built at the Zamakona shipyard for skipper George William Anderson and the Adenia Fishing Company, reports **David Linkie**.

Two hundred guests from Denmark, England, Ireland, Faroe, Norway, Scotland, Shetland and Spain attended the launching ceremony in Spain. Adenia was named in the traditional manner by the skipper's wife, Ruby Anderson, before their granddaughters, Faye, Lorina and Mollie, smashed a further three bottles for good luck.

Featuring a beam of 15.6m and 10 RSW tanks, Adenia was designed by Karl Sandvik of Salt Ship Design, a longtime friend of the owners, who also project-managed the new build.

Adenia is expected to arrive at Shetland later this month, in time for the North Sea herring fishery.

- The proposed generating capacity of the offshore wind farm will exceed 100 MW and therefore it will be a nationally significant infrastructure project and will be authorised by a DCO.
- The proposed application for development consent for Hornsea Four is being compiled by and consulted upon by the Applicant.
- Hornsea Four is "EA development" for the purposes of The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. This means that the proposed works involved constitute development for which an Environmental Impact Assessment is required and the proposed application for a DCO will therefore be accompanied by an Environmental Statement (ES).
- The offshore wind turbines will be located in the western portion of the former Hornsea Round 3 Zone (referred to as the "array area"), which has a total area of 600 km² and is located approximately 65 km (at its closest point) off Flamborough Head on the Yorkshire coast.
- The proposed DCO will, among other things, license and authorise:

Offshore:

- the construction and operation of up to 180 offshore wind turbines, with a maximum blade tip height of 370 metres (above lowest astronomical tide) and their foundations;
- the construction of up to 10 offshore platforms within the array area, accommodating either (depending on final design):
 - high voltage alternating current (HVAC) consisting of up to 6 transformer substations and up to 1 accommodation platform, or
 - high voltage direct current (HVDC) consisting of up to 6 transformer substations, up to 3 offshore HVDC converter platforms, and up to 1 accommodation platforms.
- offshore HVAC booster substations may be included at locations within the offshore cable route (at the surface);
- the construction of a network of subsea array and interconnector cables connecting the wind turbines, offshore booster substations, offshore converter stations and offshore accommodation platform;

- the construction of up to 6 underground electrical cable transition joint bays, housing the connections between the offshore subsea export cables and the onshore underground export cables;
- the construction of underground export cables buried in up to 6 trenches, running in a south / south-westerly direction for approximately 40 km. The export cables connect to Creyke Beck National Grid substation, located between Cottingham and Beverley in East Riding of Yorkshire;

SMALLER MANUFACTURING NATIONS in Asia have seen a rise in the value of exports to the US in the wake of the ongoing trade dispute between the world's two largest trading partners, according to new analysis by Sea-Intelligence.

Using data from US Customs and Border Protection reported by the US Census Bureau showing the value of US imports, Sea-Intelligence said it was clear how Chinese exports had "absolutely dominated US imports" for the past 15 years, despite contracting by 10% in the first six months of this year.

Goods to the value of \$539bn were imported from China last year, Sea-Intelligence noted, compared with China's nearest rival Japan, which was accounted for about \$10bn per month."

The figures show not just the dominance of China on the transpacific trade, and why the trade war is such an "important and sensitive" topic, but also demonstrate that the fall in imports this year to date is not much outside the normal seasonal swings in the value of goods imported from China.

"We do not wish to diminish the impact of the trade war, and it is clear that 2019 has not seen the same post-Chinese New Year uptick as in previous years, and Chinese exports to the US have seen a heavy contraction in 2019, Sea-Intelligence said.

"That said, we do feel the need to highlight the limited impact so far, as the heavy press coverage of the trade war can often leave the impression, that we are experiencing an outright implosion of US imports from China, or that we are seeing fundamental realignment of sourcing patterns away from China."

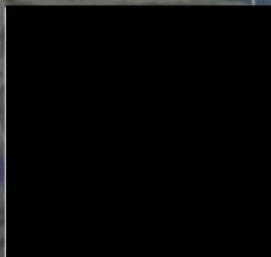

Corbyn urges opposition leaders and Tory rebels to help oust PM

The Labour leader proposed that he should lead a temporary administration on a "strictly time-limited" basis with the aim of calling a general election. His letter threw down

the gauntlet to the Lib Dems, the SNP, Plaid Cymru, the Greens and rebel Tories at a time when MPs opposed to no deal have been discussing a "national unity government" led by a centrist figure. Corbyn's proposal makes it clear that the Labour frontbench consider he is the only politician who could lead a caretaker government, rather than a backbench candidate such as the Tory veteran Ken Clarke or Labour's Yvette Cooper. Jo Swinson, the leader of the Lib Dems, immediately dismissed the idea that Corbyn could be a caretaker

prime minister, saying: "Jeremy Corbyn is not the person who is going to be able to build an even temporary majority in the House of Commons for this task - I would expect there are people in his own party and indeed the necessary Conservative backbenchers who would be unwilling to support him. It is a nonsense." But others were more amenable, with the SNP and Plaid Cymru saying they would be willing to enter talks, although Liz Saville Roberts, the Plaid leader, said it was "extremely disappointing" that Corbyn would not

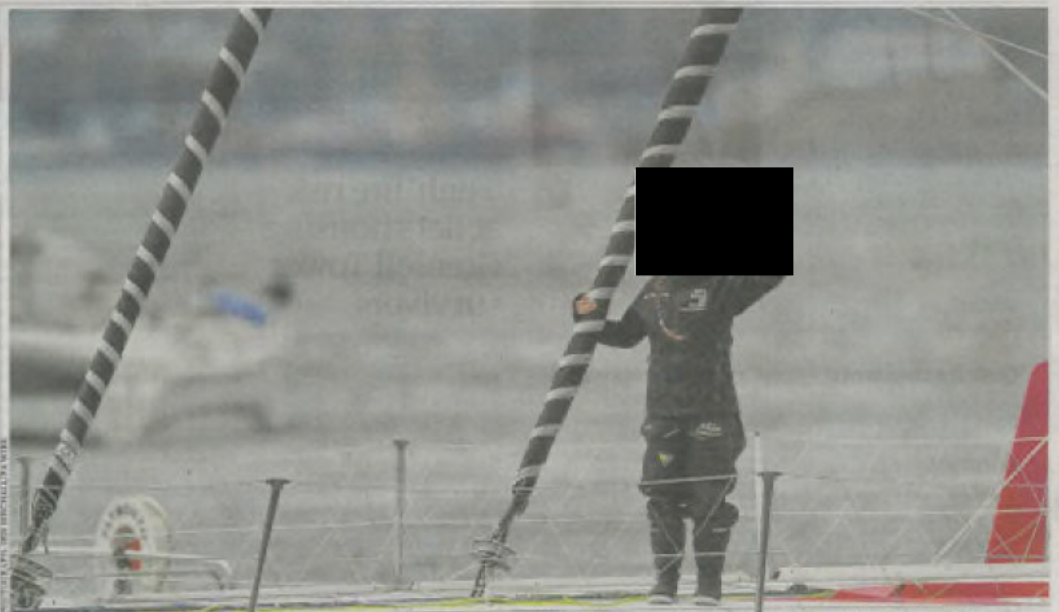

Plane crash footballer 'exposed to fatal gas'

The footballer Emiliano Sala and the pilot flying the plane he was in when it crashed in the Channel were probably exposed to "potentially fatal" levels of carbon monoxide, investigators have announced. Toxicology tests on the Cardiff City footballer found levels of carboxyhaemoglobin - formed in the blood when exposed to carbon monoxide (CO) - above the point doctors consider to be fatal. Inspectors at the Air Accident Investigations Board (AAIB) said that as the cockpit of the Piper Malibu light aircraft was not separated from the cabin when it crashed in January, it was likely that the pilot, David Ibbotson, would also have been affected. The report reveals Sala had CO saturation levels of 58% in his blood. Levels in excess of 50% are "generally considered potentially fatal", doctors said. The AAIB said the gas could "reduce

We love her infinitely, says family of Nora Quoirin, day after her body found in jungle

A postmortem on Nora Quoirin, the 15-year-old girl whose body was found in the Malaysian jungle, has yet to determine a definitive cause of death and is set to continue, police have said.

The body of the teenager, from London, was discovered by a team of local hikers on Tuesday afternoon. She had been missing for 10 days.

Nora was found unclothed, in a steep, inaccessible ravine near a stream, just over a mile from the resort in Negeri Sembilan where she had been staying with her family. Her body was taken by helicopter to a hospital, according to an official.

Police said the area had been

searched by rescue teams days earlier. Nora's parents - her mother, Meabh Quoirin, and father, Sebastien - identified her on Tuesday night.

The autopsy was begun yesterday by a pathologist from Kuala Lumpur general hospital, a local hospital doctor and two experts from the department of chemistry.

Speaking outside the morgue at Tuanku Ja'afar hospital yesterday, the deputy police chief in Negeri

Sembilan, Che Zakaria Othman, said: "The postmortem started at 11:45am. The four-man team are still carrying out their work so the police cannot tell the criminal investigation division the results yet. There is nothing more we can say for the moment."

It is understood that the Malaysian attorney general, Tunny Thomas, has stepped in to oversee the case and has requested test samples.

Nora had holoprosencephaly, a

neurological disorder, which limited her speech and coordination and made her "very vulnerable", her parents said. Her family said she must have been abducted as she never went anywhere by herself. The police have treated it as a missing person case, but not ruled out a "criminal element".

In a statement yesterday, the family described their agony at Nora's death in a statement, describing her as "at the heart of our family". It added: "She

is the truest, most precious girl and we love her infinitely. The cruelty of her being taken away is unbearable. Our hearts are broken. We will always love our Nora."

The family thanked those who had been involved in the search for Nora, adding: "Nora has brought people together, especially from France, Ireland, Britain and Malaysia, united in their love and support for her and her family. She has truly touched the whole world. To all our friends and family at home, we can't thank you enough for all your love."

The Lucie Blackman Trust, which has spoken on behalf of the family, called for "an end to speculation" and to "let the family grieve in peace and the authorities do their job".

Nora's father, Sebastien, is French. The Paris prosecutor's office said it had opened a criminal investigation into Nora's death; French prosecutors regularly investigate cases involving French citizens abroad.

The search for Nora had lasted 10 days and included more than 350 people, including British, French and Irish police. She disappeared on the morning of 4 August from the hotel room she was sharing with her brother and sister at the Dusan resort, in Negeri Sembilan.

Sankaran Nair, the lawyer who is representing her family, said: "They are totally distraught, totally overwhelmed. They are grieving."

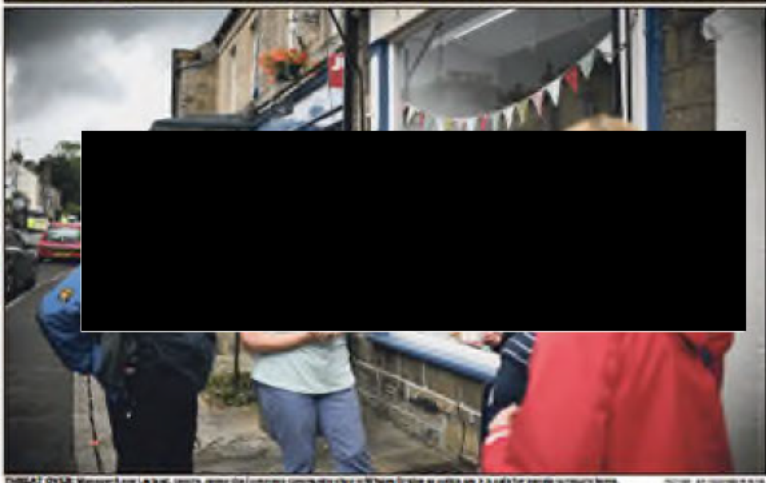
