Dear Parish Council,

I'm writing to you regarding a new offshore wind farm which Ørsted is proposing to develop, Hornsea Project Four, approximately 90 km off the Holderness Coast. Currently it is planned that the export cable from the offshore wind farm will come ashore in East Riding of Yorkshire District Council, where a buried cable will then be routed to the National Grid substation at Creyke Beck, which will involve the creation of a new onshore substation in the vicinity of this National Grid connection.

Currently, the proposal for Hornsea Project Four is at a very early stage in the development process, and there is still a great deal of consultation and environmental impact assessment work to be undertaken. The project is yet to be announced in the public domain. Early engagement has commenced with potential landowners affected by Hornsea Project Four and the Local Planning Authorities directly involved or immediately adjacent to the onshore cable route.

In order to publicise the proposals for Hornsea Project Four, we will shortly publish our Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) for Hornsea Project Four in the local media. The SoCC will give a high level overview of the project and how we will commit to consult with local authorities, Parish Councils and local communities in the vicinity of the project. The proposed publication date for this document is at the beginning of September 2018.
