Action Points from Issue Specific Hearing 2: East Riding of Yorkshire Council

Action 3: Response to ExQ1 DGN.1.4

The Local Planning Authority is satisfied with the wording of Requirement 7. We are satisfied that we have the experience and expertise to deal with the discharge of this requirement, as the authority has considerable experience of dealing with large scale applications and development consent orders.

Action 4: Design Review Process

The Local Planning Authority considers that the benefits of a design review process would be very limited, given that the design of the substation buildings is driven by the technical requirements and the site is of limited sensitivity.

Action 12: Wording of DCO and outline landscape management plan

The Local Planning Authority is satisfied with the revised wording of the DCO.

The Local Planning Authority would still prefer to see a stronger landscaped boundary along the northern side of the onshore sub-stations and associated works.

Action 18: Wording of Requirement 9

The Local Planning Authority is satisfied with the revised wording of requirement 9.

Action 23: Beverley Sanctuary Stone

The Local Planning Authority and Humber Historic Environmental Record have reviewed the document and the requirement for the production of a specific Mitigation Method Statement for the Beverley Sanctuary Stone seems reasonable, as stated in paragraph 7.6.1.3. It will allow us to adequately assess the potential impact on the stone should ensure that it is protected.

Because the stone is a Schedule Monument it would be worthwhile checking with Historic England as to whether they are happy with the proposed arrangements.
