Notice is hereby given that INRG Solar (Little Crow) Ltd of 93 Leigh Road, Eastleigh, Hampshire, SO50 9DQ ("the Applicant") proposes to make an application ("the Application") under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy for a Development Consent Order.

The Application relates to the construction, operation, maintenance and decommissioning of a renewable led energy scheme. The main element is the installation of a ground mounted solar park with a maximum design capacity of up to 150MWp (megawatts peak) and up to 90MW of battery storage covering an area of approximately 226 hectares. There will also be electrical connection infrastructure. The site is located to the east of the British Steel Works, Scunthorpe. Centred at National Grid Reference SE 94343 09820.

The scheme is an Environmental Impact Assessment development for the purposes of the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017. An Environmental Statement will be submitted as part of the application. Preliminary Environmental Information Reports (PEIR) form part of the consultation material.

Public consultation on the proposals take places from **Monday 3 December 2018** until 5pm on **Monday 4 March 2019**. 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Law Report

When expat worker is covered by UK law

Court of Appeal
Published: December 3, 2018

**Jeffery v British Council
Green v SIG Trading Ltd**

Before Lord Justice Underhill, Lord Justice Longmore and Lord Justice Peter Jackson
[2018] EWCA Civ 2253
Judgment: October 16, 2018

When determining whether there was a sufficiently close connection between an overseas employee's employment and the UK to found jurisdiction to hear a claim under the Employment Rights Act 1996, it was relevant that the employee's contract of employment contained a provision to the effect that it would be governed by English law, although that could not by itself be a decisive factor.

The Court of Appeal so held, *inter alia*, in: (i) dismissing the appeal of the defendant, the British Council, from a decision of the Employment Appeal Tribunal ([2016] IRLR 935) which allowed the appeal of the claimant, David Jeffery, against a decision of an employment tribunal and (ii) dismissing the appeal of the claimant, Jonathan Green, and allowing the cross-appeal of the defendant, SIG Trading Ltd, from a decision of the Employment Appeal Tribunal ([2017] ICR 1274) that upheld the decision of an employment tribunal. In both cases the employment tribunal had held that there was not a sufficient connection between the claimant's employment and Great Britain to found jurisdiction.

Mr James Laddie, QC, for the British Council; **Mr James Stuart** for Mr Jeffery; **Mr Edward Kemp** and **Mr Grahame Anderson** for Mr Green; **Mr Bruce Carr, QC**, for SIG Trading.

Lord Justice Underhill said that in the first case Mr Jeffery lived in Bangladesh, where he worked for the British Council. In the second case Mr Green lived in Lebanon and was employed by the defendant company to work for it in Saudi Arabia. Both cases involved claims of whistleblower detriment and unfair dismissal.

To his Lordship it seemed obvious that an express choice of English (or

Scots) law might be a relevant factor in assessing the strength of the connection of a particular employment relationship with Britain and British employment law. It was not decisive. Indeed, a choice of English law by itself would be incapable of overcoming the territorial pull of the place of work in the case of a true expatriate. An employee could not contract in to the protection of the 1996 act.

For those reasons his Lordship would reject the contention that the employment tribunal had been wrong to attach any weight to the fact that the relevant employment contract contained an express choice of English law.

It was the British Council's fall-back contention that, even if an express contractual choice of law could in principle be relevant, that could only be the case where the provision had been drawn to the employee's attention. His Lordship accepted that where both parties had consciously adverted to a choice of law clause the factor might have more weight in answering the sufficient connection question. Yet that was not the only situation where an express choice of English (or Scots) law would be relevant.

Accordingly, the employment tribunal in the first case had been right to attach weight to the fact that Mr Jeffery's contract contained an express choice of English law. Looking at all relevant factors, in the very particular circumstances of the case the only correct conclusion was that the factors connecting Mr Jeffery's employment with Great Britain outweighed the strong territorial pull of the place of work.

In the second case the employment tribunal had not disregarded the choice of law clause as a factor and its decision could not be impugned. Consequently, Mr Green's claim would be dismissed in its entirety.

Lord Justice Longmore and Lord Justice Peter Jackson delivered concurring judgments.
