The proposed land is agricultural 'food security' is important - there are no plans to clear the land and return it to 'green field' at the end of the project - the whole cleanup is not in the plans.

Sunnica will return nothing to the British economy - they are based in Spain and will pay tax there. They have no experience of "battery storage" These storage systems are highly unreliable - fires spread toxic fumes and smoke for miles - the proposed sites are too close to high population area and main roads A11 and A14 - if these have to be shut in an emergency the national economy will be hit. Fires need copious water to douse - we are in the driest part of the country; hosepipe bans and limitation of water for irrigation are a regular feature.

Solar panels are not 'green'. Most are imported from China - they make heavy demands on materials and logistics. Their production requires a huge energy input.

That Sunnica know they will have to use compulsory purchase and cause huge disruption to residents shows an awareness of what they will cause. As someone with a serious chest condition the dust and fumes during construction are a serious health threat.

Wildlife - already some of the ancient trees have been removed - they were the home/roost of bats. Ground nesting birds are protected - their area is safeguarded but any disturbance in the area will stop them returning to that field.

Please! - make builders put solar panels on all new builds. install wind turbines protect our paths - bridleways, wild life, way of life.
