Dear Michele

This is a request please for an Inspector to visit my house on the above date when in Worlington.

My house is possibly the worst affected property in the village of Worlington and completely overlooks E12 on the Sunnica map. A vast area of flat Brecklands landscape with uninterrupted views from Worlington to Badlingham.

I attach 2 letters to support my request,

A letter from our estate agent 25th Aug 2021 last year when we were forced to take our property off the market due to the Sunnica proposal. [REDACTED]

At the moment we are trapped in the property until a decision on Sunnica is reached.

A letter from Sunnica dated 29th September in which they state E12 is only 490 metres from the closest properties in Worlington to the South which includes my home.

The area of E12 is best seen from our upstairs for the Inspectors to appreciate the change to the landscape, the vast area affected and it is also an important nesting ground for Stone Curlew.

Furthermore we are now aware that the latest letters to the PI re "The Changes" from Sunnica makes mention that at each BESS/Substation site a 10 metre wall is going to be built between the transformer and the substation. This was not disclosed by Sunnica at the Bedford Lodge meeting last week.

There is a possibility this wall at [REDACTED] might be visible on the skyline from our house.

Please would you try and get my request included in the schedule for that afternoon.

As to my joining the assisted visit please book me in for that afternoon.

Thank you for your email.

We posted copies of the newsletter to 11,048 addresses inside the same area to that which we posted copies of the booklet and questionnaire during the statutory consultation. This area can be seen in Figure 3 of the Statement of Community Consultation published on our website (<https://sunnica.co.uk/wp-content/uploads/2020/09/Sunnica-Statement-of-Community-Consultation-16Sep20.pdf>).

E11 has now been removed from the developable area and will no longer have solar panels on it. Instead, the area between Worlington and E12 will be planted with native grassland. The distance between the proposed solar infrastructure at E12 and the back of the closest properties at the southern tip of Worlington is approximately 490 metres. We are still in the process of finalising our Development Consent Order (DCO) application and, if our application is accepted for examination, you will be able to view and comment on the proposals as submitted.
