This representation is made by Godolphin Management Co Ltd in response to the Sunnica document entitled "Horse Racing Industry Impact Assessment" [REP2-039] dated 11 November 2022 submitted at Deadline 2.

The authors of the Sunnica HRI Impact Assessment at paragraph 1.12 state that Godolphin is using its representations to highlight the importance of ensuring that the proposed mitigation and management measures are implemented. It is correct to say that the representations made on Godolphin's behalf by Ashtons Legal include comments upon mitigation. However, it is totally misrepresenting the statement and Godolphin's position by stating that Godolphin is in a fundamentally different position to the representations made by other representatives of the HRI, including the Jockey Club and implying that its objection is confined to that of insufficient mitigation proposals adjacent to its Snailwell gallops.

Godolphin and other members of the HRI in the Newmarket Horsemen's Group are totally agreed in their opposition to the Sunnica scheme which is not confined to mitigation but to an in-principle objection to the Sunnica scheme as a whole.

Godolphin's strong opposition to the Sunnica scheme is made clear in its representation dated 10th March 2022 where the following is stated:

"In short, Godolphin is strongly opposed to the Sunnica scheme which will have a hugely detrimental impact on the racing industry in this historic setting". It is also stated that any planning benefits from the scheme are hugely outweighed by the significant harm it will have on the horseracing industry, with the potential to drive away further investors and deter potential owners who will see an essentially rural pursuit being blighted by the presence of a huge industrial complex. This will be particularly acute at the Limekilns where Godolphin work some of its best horses on gallops which are exceptional and possibly the best in the world. The statement goes on to make the points concerning the Limekilns historic setting as well as the impact on the Godolphin gallops at Snailwell.

Godolphin is a member of the Newmarket Horsemen's Group and fully supports their objections to the Sunnica Scheme as well as those of Say No To Sunnica Action Group Limited (SNTS). It wishes to be allied with the representations made by SNTS, including those made in reply to the impact assessment document REP2-039, which it fully supports.
