I feel that throughout the whole consultation process Sunnica has not listened to the concerns of those who live in the communities affected. We will be subject to total disruption during the construction period, with the size of the vehicles, equipment and structures being put onto roads that are totally inadequate to cope with them and the volume of construction worker traffic. Many roads are C or even no category at all

From most villages whichever way we try to exit we will be subject to fields of solar panels, changing the open landscape of the Fenland Brecks we live in. Going towards Isleham there are no trees just the odd hedge or ditch between fields, which is what the landscape setting is. So subjecting us to solar panels that will be screened with vegetation that even in 15 years of continuous growth (if that is possible, who is going to “care” for them) will not cover the view of the solar panels and will totally destroy the outlook setting that we have as a villages on the edge of the fens.

The increased size of BESS storage highlights that Sunnica were totally unprepared for NOT getting direct access to the National Grid at Burwell is another prime example of the poor design and research done for this scheme. Who would buy a gas cooker for a new home only to find that actually there is no gas link to the new homes, where was their research for obtaining permission for linking to the National Grid at Burwell?

It totally changes the scheme from being “green solar energy” to just being storage for when power is cheap to buy off the National Grid to sell at a higher price when demand is higher. So it is not even going to be green or renewable energy that they are trying to insist to us that it is.

I care about the community I live in and get involved. I am a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and work hard to ensure that things run smoothly even to the point of helping when road closures happen to ensure

that people know how they can still access the village hall as a resident or as someone coming into the village which I have just done for the Anglian Water SPA pipeline work.
