Minutes

1. Welcome and introductions

Introductions were made.

2. NCC posed questions to the Applicant (<u>RR-064</u>). The Applicant responded (<u>REP2-039</u>, lines 68-70). Do these responses satisfy NCC?

JL noted that the comments were offered as observations and as part of the full and proper review of the assessment of human health. BC thanked JL for the thoroughness of the review. JL confirmed that NCC had no further comment. There was some discussion about the potential for public concern about EMF. If the matter arises the Applicant will address it through Project communication channels.

3. In <u>PD-012</u>, the Examining Authority puts two questions to NCC regarding mitigation and assessment scope (Q2.6.4.6 and Q2.6.4.7 respectively). Does the NCC agree with the Examining Authority's summary?

JL explained that NCC had just submitted a response to the Examining Authority regarding Q2.6.4.6 and Q2.6.4.7. These relate to item 2 in the agenda. SF shared a screen to show the response. JL noted that the Public Health team requested no additional mitigation and expressed a willingness to continue engaging with the Applicant if and when needed.

4. In <u>PD-012</u>, Q2.6.4.2(a), Corpusty and Saxthorpe Parish Council requests sight of the minutes of the 22 April 2022 meeting between NCC & Equinor (attached). Does NCC agree that the Applicant can make these minutes available through submission to the examination?

JL and SF said that NCC had no objection to the minutes of the 22 April 2022 meeting being shared with Corpusty and Saxthorpe Parish Council and any other interested parties. DR thanked NCC for this and said that the Applicant would issue the minutes to the Examining Authority.

5. Timeline

There was some discussion about ways in which to record this agreement in the Statement of Common Ground (SoCG). It was agreed that a section on health would be added to the draft SoCG between the Applicant and NCC, which would be issued for Deadline 4 (16th May 2023).
