1	Thank you for consulting Historic England on the Applicant's proposed provision for the compulsory acquisition of additional land. Historic England is the Government's lead advisor on the historic environment, and we are a non-departmental public body sponsored by, and reporting to the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport. Historic England is satisfied that the proposed changes to the Application relating to the provision for the compulsory acquisition of additional land would not result in any additional impact to designated heritage assets. We have no additional comments to make regarding the current proposed changes and our existing advice in our Written Representation remains valid.	The Applicant notes this response.

1	Anglian Water notes that the cable corridor has widened slightly which would allow flexibility for micro-siting the cable at detailed design phase. There is an Anglian Water asset in this location; however, this asset is not affected any differently as a result of the change request application. Anglian Water is continuing engagement with Equinor regarding the Protective Provisions for our assets in this regard. The access route to the cable corridor has been realigned to follow the existing Food Enterprise Park access. There is an Anglian Water asset underneath the access road but as no below ground works are proposed in this location as only access rights are sought by Equinor, there would not be any interference with the asset.	The Applicant notes this response and is continuing to engage with Anglian Water in relation to the Protective Provisions.

3	National Highways has been appointed by the Secretary of State for Transport as a strategic highway company under the provisions of the Infrastructure Act 2015 and is the highway authority, traffic authority, and street authority for the Strategic Road Network (SRN). The SRN is a critical national asset and as such we work to ensure that it operates and is managed in the public interest. This is both in respect of current activities and needs as well as in providing effective stewardship of its long-term operation and integrity.	Noted. No response required.
4	The onshore cable corridor for Sheringham Extension Project (SEP) and Dudgeon Extension Project (DEP) passes through the Phase 2 of the Food Enterprise Park (FEP) development site, south of the A47 trunk road. 9	It is important to note that under the approved National Highways A47 North Tuddenham to Easton DCO, powers to permanently acquire new land or new rights will be introduced to the areas overlapping with the Sheringham and Dudgeon Extension Projects DCO. This includes new statutory utility interest that will need protections within Equinor's DCO Protective Provisions. As this is already mentioned in our Deadline 03 submission, therefore, we are not adding any further details here.	Protective provisions for the benefit of National Highways have been included in part 14 of Schedule 14 to the draft DCO (Revision H) [document 3.1]. These provisions require the undertaker to obtain approval from National Highways prior to exercising its powers of compulsory acquisition under the DCO.
10	With this current notice of material change application, National Highways is concerned about the material change because to date it doesn't have any agreed protective provisions in place with the applicant and the applicant says it isn't in a position to progress and agree a co-operation agreement with National Highways until nearer construction and therefore not before the examination closes. Without any agreed protections in place, National Highways isn't in a position to say if it is happy with the material change. When agreed protections are in place, National Highways may be able to change its view.	Protective provisions for the benefit of National Highways have been included in part 14 of Schedule 14 to the draft DCO (Revision H) [document 3.1]. Although these are subject to ongoing negotiations the Applicant believes the parties will be able to reach an agreed position on Protective Provisions by the close of the Examination. As confirmed in the Applicant's Statutory Undertakers Position Statement (Revision B) [RR3-083] the Applicant has agreed with National Highways the principle of entering into a cooperation agreement in relation to overlap of SEP and DEP with the A47 North Tuddenham to Easton DCO and has provided detailed heads of terms to National Highways. The terms of the proposed cooperation agreement go beyond the scope of the protective provisions and are aimed at managing cooperation between the two complex developments. Given the complexity of the developments, the terms will require detailed consideration and negotiation albeit the Applicant still hopes to reach agreement with National Highways before the end of the Examination. Notwithstanding the above matters, the Applicant asserts that National Highways could provide a 'without prejudice' review of the highway technical details to the ExA.

1	Thank you for consulting the County Council on the Applicant's Change Request of 11 April. The County Council in its role as the Highway Authority, Lead Local Flood Authority, and the Historic Environment team (archaeological advisors) has no concerns regarding the amendments proposed by the applicants. However, the County Council has the following Natural Environment comments.	Comment noted. No response required.
2	It is noted in section 3.4 Onshore Ecology and Ornithology (para 64) that a worst-case scenario of an open cut crossing across Church Lane has been assessed and that the amount of vegetation removed (the construction easement) is the same as previously proposed. The County Council is satisfied with the conclusion set out in para 68 that "no materially new or materially different ecological impacts are anticipated as a result of the proposed change". However, the option of a trenchless crossing across Church Lane is our preference as this would reduce the overall impact on the adjacent hedgerow and woodland planting.	The Applicant notes Norfolk County Council's preference for trenchless crossing (HDD) across Church Lane. At this point in time the Applicant is unable to commit to either open cut or trenchless crossing, and both options remain open until detailed design stage. Should open cut be selected, a reduced working width of 20m would be adopted and micrositing of the cable implemented, based on the finding of ecological and arboricultural surveys, to reduce to impacts to existing habitats as far as possible. Details of the mitigation measures are outlined in the Supplemental Environmental Information Report [AS-063].
