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Glossary of Terms

Dudgeon Offshore Wind Farm Extension Project (DEP)	The Dudgeon Offshore Wind Farm Extension onshore and offshore sites including all onshore and offshore infrastructure.
DEP offshore site	The Dudgeon Offshore Wind Farm Extension consisting of the DEP wind farm site, interlink cable corridors and offshore export cable corridor (up to mean high water springs).
DEP onshore site	The Dudgeon Offshore Wind Farm Extension onshore area consisting of the DEP onshore substation site, onshore cable corridor, construction compounds, temporary working areas and onshore landfall area.
DEP wind farm site	The offshore area of DEP within which wind turbines, infield cables and offshore substation platform/s will be located and the adjacent Offshore Temporary Works Area. This is also the collective term for the DEP North and South array areas.
Horizontal directional drilling (HDD) zones	The areas within the onshore cable route which would house HDD entry or exit points.
Jointing bays	Underground structures constructed at regular intervals along the onshore cable route to join sections of cable and facilitate installation of the cables into the buried ducts.
Landfall	The point at the coastline at which the offshore export cables are brought onshore, connecting to the onshore cables at the transition joint bay above mean high water
Onshore cable corridor	The area between the landfall and the onshore substation sites, within which the onshore cable circuits will be installed along with other temporary works for construction.
Onshore export cables	The cables which would bring electricity from the landfall to the onshore substation. 220 – 230kV.
Onshore Substation	Compound containing electrical equipment to enable connection to the National Grid.
Order Limits	The area subject to the application for development consent, including all permanent and temporary works for SEP and DEP.

1 Introduction

1.1 Background

- This Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) has been prepared by Equinor New Energy Limited (the Applicant) and Norwich Western Link (NWL). It identifies areas of the Sheringham Shoal Offshore Wind Farm Extension Project (SEP) and Dudgeon Offshore Wind Farm Extension Project (DEP) Development Consent Order (DCO) application (the Application) where matters are agreed, not agreed or that remain under discussion between the parties.
- 2. The Applicant has had regard to the Planning Act 2008: Guidance for the examination of applications for development consent (Department for Communities and Local Government, 2015) when compiling this SoCG.
- This SoCG has been structured to reflect topics of the Application which are of interest to NWL. The applicable matters considered within this SoCG apply to NWL's non-statutory remit.
- 4. Topic specific matters agreed, not agreed and matters that remain under discussion between the Applicant and NWL are included within this SoCG. Matters that are not yet agreed will be the subject of ongoing discussion between the Applicant and NWL to reach agreement wherever possible, or to refine the extent of disagreement between parties.
- 5. Throughout the SoCG the phrase "Agreed" identifies any point of agreement between the Applicant and NWL. The phrase "Not Agreed" identifies any point that is not agreed between the Applicant and NWL.

1.2 Summary of 'Agreed', 'Not Agreed' and 'In Discussion' Matters

- 6. In order to easily identify whether a matter is 'agreed', 'not agreed' or 'in discussion', the colour coding system set out in **Table 2** has been used.
- 7. Details on specific matters that are 'agreed', 'not agreed' or 'in discussion' between the Applicant and NWL are presented in **Table 5**.

8. 

5	The Applicant considers that as the Norwich Western Link project has not yet received consent and has postponed making a planning application and Highways Act 1980 applications due to funding issues, and that therefore there is the absence of certainty over whether the NWL scheme will go ahead at all, and if it does go ahead on what timescales that will be, it would be unreasonable for protective provisions to be imposed on the DCO undertaker for the benefit of a scheme which has this degree of uncertainty. For these reasons the protective provisions are unreasonable and inappropriate and should not be included in the DCO. The Applicant had understood that the agreed position from a meeting on 17 May 2023 was that protective provisions would not be required. The Applicant had not anticipated receiving a set of protective provisions for the benefit of NWL and prior to receiving them the day before Deadline 7 had not been made aware of them.	The Norwich Western Link is a priority scheme for Norfolk County Council as set out in its Local Transport Plan 4 and its Implementation Plan. The Department for Transport approved a Strategic Outline Business Case in May 2020 giving provisional entry into the Large Local Majors Programme and Norfolk County Council is awaiting approval of its Outline Business Case before making a planning application and the associated statutory orders. There is no indication that the Outline Business Case will not be approved. It isn't unusual for publicly promoted infrastructure projects not yet in existence to seek protective provisions in DCOs. For example, National Highways secured protective provisions in the Thurrock Flexible Generation Plant Development Consent Order 2022 (see Part 8 of Schedule 8 to that Order) to protect its then forthcoming Lower Thames Crossing. Protective Provision are being proposed pending the cooperation agreement being signed.	Not Agreed – no material impact on the conclusions of the EIA
