(a) notice of the application was given to the persons identified under regulation 11; and

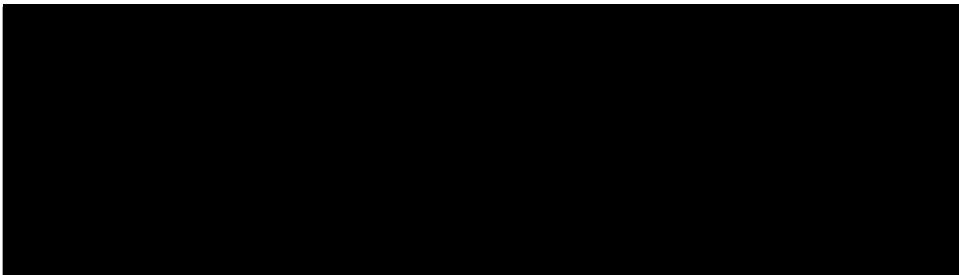
(b) a copy of the accepted application, including the environmental statement and a map was given to the consultation bodies in accordance with regulation 16

— in relation to the application for an order to grant development consent to construct, operate and maintain Medworth Energy from Waste (EfW) Combined Heat and Power (CHP) Facility (Medworth CHP), which is situated within the administrative areas of Cambridgeshire County Council, Fenland District Council, Norfolk County Council and the Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk, in the counties of Cambridgeshire and Norfolk. The Scheme is located in the town of Wisbech and will include a CHP connection along the route of the disused March to Wisbech Railway to the north, a grid connection along the verge of the A47 to a proposed new substation adjacent to UKPN's existing substation, access improvements and water connections.
