We will give the same consideration to any matter, whether it is raised once or several times.

Livestream: There will be a livestream recording of the event, a link will be posted on the project page before the start of the event.

These must be sent before the relevant deadline, Deadline 3 (Tuesday 25 April 2023) for ISH2, CAH1 and CAH2 and Deadline 4 (Thursday 25 May 2023) for ISH3, ISH4 and ISH5.
