My family and I strongly object to this application being granted and we have read the latest responses and would like to reiterate our original objection. The most important thing we must all consider is the effect this incinerator would have on the health and well being of all the Wisbech and surrounding area's residents and workforce, but especially the children.

Burning waste produces toxic emissions which are not all captured and no matter what MVV says this will affect everyone's health especially the children. The vast amounts of pollutants that will contaminate the air, soil and water will end up entering the food chain and our lungs. Burning waste is hazardous for health and the environment and the tiny particles of dust can lead to decreased lung function, irregular heartbeat, heart attacks and inevitably **premature deaths.**

It is unbelievable that it could be considered to build such a monstrosity in a town and worryingly within a stones throw from the Thomas Clarkson School which is the largest school in the area. There are two infant and primary schools (Elm Road School and Ramnoth Road School) and housing which are also in close proximity. The roads are at breaking point as it is, the extra hundreds of vehicles in and out of the town would add even more pollution to the air quality. Wisbech is thirty miles from the sea so not even centrally located and not easily accessible. Boston incinerator has recently been passed which is only approx. 30 miles away and there is already an incinerator located in Peterborough which is even closer, so another incinerator in Wisbech is not needed or wanted. As there will be two incinerators in less than a thirty mile radius of Wisbech how would a third in my town help the country achieve NET ZERO?

I note that confirmation has been given by Simon Ridgewell, Samantha Hoy of Cambs County, Fenland District & Wisbech Town Councillor and also members of the Wisbech Without Incineration Group have also submitted proof that Nestle Purina and Lamb Weston will not be purchasing power from MVV.

Please do not grant this application for the sake of our health
