My main concerns and objections are as follows,

The site in which it is proposed to be built on is an area that is subject to flooding in the near future and this investment would not be profitable and that is a sure fact.

The local infrastructure would not cope as it is not suitable to carry the extra 300 lorries a day. The local people of Wisbech will suffer due to the extra traffic on the roads, the lorries going to this site will not stick to the A47 they will be regularly diverted through Wisbech cause build backs in traffic.
