Dear Secretary of State,

Further to your request for information to Interested Parties, I can confirm that Norfolk County Council understands that the applicant has **no** arrangements for use of the Combined Heat and Power (CHP).

This incinerator therefore fails on the optimisation of energy test.

It also fails on Climate Change. It would needlessly add to greenhouse gases and plastic pollution, due to its transportation of Residual Waste by road, from areas of high population, to areas of low population, against the proximity principle.

Road transport is now known to be the third largest cause of the plastic pollution that enters our rivers and streams.

It is not only vehicle exhausts that cause pollution, it is the plastics from tyres and emissions from brakes, in contact with the road, even in electric vehicles, that create the plastic pollution on our roads, that runs into watercourses, rivers and seas

Heavy vehicles and maximum size HGV's going to the Medworth Incinerator, would seriously cause more pollution in the East of England.

This is a course the Government must not take.

Please reject the incinerator.
