#### About the Issue Specific Hearing

The main purpose of this ISH on the draft DCO is to undertake an examination of the draft DCO Articles and Schedules.

In particular to:

- clarify issues around how the draft DCO is intended to work what would be consented, the extent of the powers and what requirements, provisions and agreements are proposed;
- identify any possible issues of prevention, mitigation or compensation which are not covered by the draft DCO, as currently drafted; and
- establish or confirm the views of other IPs as to the appropriateness, proportionality or efficacy of the proposals.

The ExA may add other issues for consideration, may alter the order in which issues are considered and will seek to allocate sufficient time to each issue to allow proper consideration of them. Any lack of discussion of a particular issue at a Hearing does not preclude further examination of this issue, including the asking of further written questions. Every effort will be made to ensure that the issues will be discussed on the day that they are scheduled for. Should the consideration of these issues take less time than anticipated, the ExA may conclude the Hearing as soon as all relevant contributions have been made and all questions asked and responded to.

If there are additional matters to be dealt with or there are submissions that take a considerable amount of time, there may be a need to continue the session for longer on the day. Alternatively, it may be necessary to prioritise matters and defer others to further written questions.

## **Attendees/ Participation**

All IPs are welcome to attend this Hearing. However, IPs will need to register their attendance with the Planning Inspectorate's Case Team no later than **noon** on **Tuesday 8 March 2022**, as joining instructions will need to be issued in advance of the Hearing. An Arrangements Conference will be held for parties that have registered to make an oral submission or that the ExA has invited to participate. Those parties should please join the Arrangements Conference promptly using the instructions that are sent to them.

The Arrangements Conference will be hosted by the Case Team and will cover housekeeping arrangements and allow for questions to be asked about the Hearing arrangements. The ExA will not be present and there will not be a public livestream of the Arrangements Conference.

Subject to the ExA's power of control over the conduct of the Hearings, it will invite relevant parties to make an oral submission at the appropriate point in the agenda.

The Hearing and Arrangements Conference are being held in Microsoft Teams. Information on how to participate is provided in the <u>Planning Inspectorate's</u> <u>Advice Note 8.6</u>.



It is the Applicant's intention to livestream the Hearing, and a link to watch the livestream will be posted on the <u>project webpage of the Planning Inspectorate's</u> <u>National Infrastructure Planning website</u> closer to the event date. # 1. Welcome, introductions, arrangements for the Hearing

## 2. Articles and Schedules of the draft DCO

The Applicant will be asked to provide a very brief overview of each part of the draft DCO. The ExA will then ask questions in respect of DCO powers, seeking responses where appropriate from the Applicant, the Local Authorities and other IPs, who have registered to speak. These IPs will also be invited to ask questions of clarification in relation to DCO Articles and Schedules.

## **3.** Schedule 2 of the draft DCO – Requirements

The Applicant will be asked to provide an overview of the Requirements with particular focus on Requirements 5, 6, 16, 17, 25, 28, 29, 30, 33 and 38 (based on the Requirements as set out in the most recent version of the draft DCO [REP3-003] at the time of preparing this draft agenda). The ExA will then ask questions, seeking responses where appropriate from the Applicant, the Local Authorities, and any other IPs who have registered to speak. These IPs will also be invited to ask questions of clarification in relation to the draft DCO requirements.

#### 4. Article 41 of the draft DCO – Certification of Plans

To review the plans and documents to be certified and seek views as to whether the list is complete and if not, what additional documents would need to be included.

Note: The Content part of the draft DCO [<u>REP3-003</u>], related to the list of Articles appears to be numbered incorrectly. Article 32 (Statutory authority to override easements and other rights) has been removed from the main body of the Articles in the DCO, but not from the contents page. Therefore, all subsequent Articles, in the main body of the draft DCO have been renumbered, with the Certification of Plans, becoming Article 41 and not Article 42, as listed on the contents page.

#### 5. Consents, licences and other agreements

The Applicant will be asked to provide an update of progress and timescales for completion. The ExA will then ask questions, including discussing



whether any Planning Obligations/ Section 106 agreements are proposed and if they are indicative timescales for finalising them.
