Thank you for your letter of 22 April 2024 confirming the decision made by the Planning Inspectorate, on behalf of the Secretary of State, to accept our application for a Development Consent Order for the Five Estuaries Offshore Wind Farm Project (reference EN010115) for examination.

Historic environment plans show a woodland layer on the key, but this is not visible on the plans. These plans also show ancient woodland which may not be required in the historic environment context and could be included in the Statutory or Non-Statutory Sites and Features of Nature Conservation - Onshore plans (Doc 2.13).	all consistent, rather than having different base mapping. No changes are proposed at this stage as the woodland layer is not key to understanding the plans or a statutory feature. 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Archaeology and Cultural Heritage (document reference 6.3.7) and Offshore Archaeology and Cultural Heritage	where the text stating 'Figure XX' is not present, but there is a hyperlink to the figure embedded within the pdf. The ES should be checked throughout and reissued with the correct text showing. The chapter refers to the different onshore development areas as 'section X' throughout, this is then translated to the rest of the ES onshore chapters, rather than using the dDCO work nos. to describe the onshore development. A clarification plan overlaying the work nos. to the sections referred to in the ES would aid the reader. Figure 1.8 (Sheet 2 of 2) has some items on the legend that do not match the symbols on the drawing. The figures have been exported at a low quality, with some symbols hard to read. Onshore Export Cable Corridor (ECC) Flood Risk Assessment (Doc 5.3.1)	The Flood Risk Assessment (FRA) describes that the Proposed Development is primarily located in Flood Zone 1, with areas in Flood Zone 2 and Flood Zone 3. The FRA does not specify whether the components located within Flood Zone 3 are Flood Zone 3a or Flood Zone 3b or a combination. Flood Zone 3a and Flood Zone 3b are not differentiated on the figures in the FRA. An updated FRA with plans differentiating Flood Zone 3a and 3b should be reissued.	The Onshore Export Cable Corridor Flood Risk Assessment (document reference 5.3.1) confirms that the cable route crosses areas of Flood Zone 3 in the vicinity of landfall at Holland Haven Marshes and at the point where the cable corridor crosses Tendring Brook and the upper reaches of Holland Brook. There is no delineation of Flood Zone 3a and Flood Zone 3b within the Tendring District Council Strategic Flood Risk Assessment and therefore no delineation is included within the project Flood Risk Assessment.

The OLEMP does not appear to contain any commitments regarding the maintenance of the proposed mitigation planting and neither is this covered in R7 (Provision of landscaping) of the dDCO.	Revision B of this document, addressing the issue with the legibility of the figure, has been submitted to the Planning Inspectorate with this letter. The Outline Landscape and Ecological Management Plan (OLEMP) (document reference 9.22) outlines a draft planting scheme which is subject to final design. The final LEMP will be produced post DCO determination, it will include design, maintenance and management measures, to be approved by the relevant planning authority as per Requirement 7 and Section 11 of the OLEMP (document reference 9.22). Commitments within Schedule of Mitigation – Routemap (document reference 9.31): ID 92 and ID 215 outline the commitment to inspections of species up to 5 years ensuring successful establishment and replacement of failures.
Outline Skills and Employment Strategy (document reference 9.27)	The ledgers for figures 4 and 5 are not legible due to the resolution being too low.	No changes are proposed at this stage. This will be updated and submitted for a future deadline.
