Why we are writing to you

This letter is sent to you as part of a statutory consultation exercise on the Scheme carried out pursuant to section 42 of the Planning Act 2008. We are consulting with you as, having carried out diligent inquiry, we think that you may be a person who has an interest in land which falls within the proposed development area or which may be affected by the proposed development. Whilst this information is considered up to date at the time this consultation takes place, this is an ongoing process. The identification of all land interests to which the Scheme relates is still being finalised prior to submission of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application.

Following the consultation period, the Applicant will finalise the design of the Scheme having had regard to the consultation responses received during this period. The Applicant will then submit to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (the "Secretary of State") an application for a DCO that will authorise the construction, operation (which includes maintenance) and decommissioning of the Scheme. The Planning Inspectorate (PINS) will administer the process for the examination of the DCO application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

The Scheme

The Scheme will be located on land within and to the south of Flixborough Industrial Estate, to the north west of Scunthorpe, North Lincolnshire. The application land encompasses an area within and adjacent to Flixborough Port (RMS Trent Ports) on the east bank of the River Trent.

The DCO will, amongst other things, authorise:

- an energy recovery facility (ERF), including:

Updated proposals for North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park revealed

Updated proposals for the North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park, planned to be located on the Flixborough Industrial Estate, will be open for public consultation from 14 June to 25 July 2021.

The proposals for the energy park, announced last year by Solar 21, are designed to recover energy from waste while using as many of the by-products from the process as possible. It will be one of the first energy recovery facilities in the UK to use carbon capture, storage and utilisation technology and will also include a plastic recycling facility and hydrogen, heat and battery storage. Low-carbon energy would be supplied to local homes and businesses through a district network.

The plans have been refined significantly since an initial round of consultation in 2020, taking into account public feedback. They now also include a visitor centre for local schools and colleges, improved links for pedestrians and cyclists and the creation of a new wetland landscape for local people to enjoy.

Due to the amount of energy that the North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park would generate, the project is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project. This means it will need to obtain planning consent from the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy. The consultation is taking place in line with requirements set by the Planning Act 2008 for projects of this type.

Local residents can find out more by viewing a virtual exhibition online, taking part in online Q&As or booking an appointment to speak directly with the project team. These will be by telephone, or in-person if COVID 19 rules allow. All consultation documents will be available to view at locations in the community and online at [REDACTED]

Colin Hammond, Project Director for North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park, said:

“As a country, we need to transform the way we heat our homes, power our industries and travel around, to meet the challenges of climate change. At the North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park, we will use a truly innovative set of technologies to help meet all of these challenges while fulfilling a vital public service and furthering the UK’s green revolution.

“We expect our plans to prevent 760,000 tonnes of waste going to landfill and to generate enough low-carbon energy for three times the number of homes in North Lincolnshire every year, as well as to create 300 jobs. We will also leave the area around the project site a better place for local people to walk and cycle around.

Green energy park seeks public views

Backers of a green energy park in North Lincolnshire, which includes an energy-from-waste plant and plastics recycling facility, have issued a public consultation on revised plans.

Developer Solar 21 said a number of modifications had been made following an earlier consultation concerning the site at Flixborough (*pictured*).

It said in the [new consultation](#) that the North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park could create up to 257 new jobs and "help establish the right conditions for another 1,000 new jobs overall by attracting businesses to the area".

Because it represents substantial energy infrastructure, the project needs a development consent order from the Planning Inspectorate rather than conventional planning permission.

Under Solar 21's plans, an energy-from-waste plant would be built sufficient to convert up to 760,000 tonnes a year of refuse-derived fuel and non-hazardous waste into electricity and heat.

There would also be a plastic recycling facility to process 20,000 tonnes a year of material.

Fly ash and bottom ash produced by the plant will be used on-site to make concrete blocks for the construction industry.

Some of the electricity produced by the plant will be used to extract hydrogen from water by electrolysis, creating a clean vehicle fuel or used towards a decarbonised gas supply.

There will also be heat and energy supplied to local homes and businesses.

How the new site could look

Residents and businesses are being given the chance to have their say on plans for a new energy park on the Flixborough Industrial Estate site in Lincolnshire.

The North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park is an innovative proposal utilising a combination of technologies, to ensure that as much energy as possible is recovered from waste that cannot be recycled. It could eventually include a glasshouse development and business park including up to 40,000 square metres of business space making use of heat and carbon dioxide from the Energy Recovery Facility.

The proposals for the park, announced last year by Solar 21, could create up to 257 jobs and support the longer-term sustainability of the port. There would also be a major emphasis on creating training opportunities at the site, including an apprenticeship scheme with up to 100 places.

It will be the first energy recovery facility in the UK to use carbon capture, storage and utilisation technology and will also include a plastic recycling facility and hydrogen, heat and battery storage.

It will all make a major contribution to waste management across the region and in doing so will generate enough energy to meet the needs of up to 221,000 homes. It could also provide power, heat and cooling to the proposed new hospital in Scunthorpe.

The plans have been refined significantly since an initial round of consultation, taking into account public feedback. They now also include a visitor centre for local schools and colleges, improved links for pedestrians and cyclists and the creation of a new wetland landscape for local people to enjoy.

Colin Hammond, Project Director for North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park, said: "As a country, we need to transform the way we heat our homes, power our industries and travel around, to meet the challenges of climate change. At the North Lincolnshire Green Energy Park, we will use a truly innovative set of technologies to help meet all of these challenges while fulfilling a vital public service and furthering the UK's green revolution.

"We expect our plans to prevent 760,000 tonnes of waste going to landfill and to generate enough low-carbon energy for three times the number of homes in North Lincolnshire every year, as well as to create more than 250 jobs. We will also leave the area around the project site a better place for local people to walk and cycle around.
