I would like to offer my views as regard Rampion 2 's planning application within the Cowfold area.

I refer to the above reference and would like to quote that I am opposed to the Rampion 2 site in Cowfold.

I am unable to registered on the Horsham site and would like you to put my case forward for me in both cases if it goes to committee or otherwise.

I am totally against this development and wish that more thoughts would be put into the positioning that is proposed.

I have not received any communications from Rampion 2 even though I live opposite the proposed site.

A Rampion 2 representative quoted that it would not affect me !!

I cannot believe that to help with using large areas of grasslands and hedgerows is helping the problem to help the environment.

To take hedgerows and especially endanger wildlife is not a way forward in helping either situation.

The road that is intended to use by these lorries is not wide enough and also evidence is the length of the A272 from Cowfold to Bolney of lorries etc. leaving the road and running on the verges.

We have had so many accidents with cars ending up in fields and people being hurt and killed that certify this.

Emergency vehicles are badly held up from getting to scenes that they are trying to get to with weaving in and out of standing traffic to get through already.

To have the amount of Lorries that would be required is unbelievable to how the road will be able to cope.

The pollution from this with Cowfold already above the limit for us humans would be totally unacceptable.

The side roads are mainly single track and no room for lorries.

If there should ever be a situation like an accidents where would the traffic be able to use. We have such limited single tract side roads all of which would be unsuitable.

I can see a need for some sort of trying to conserve power but to take one thing and up another I do not believe is the way forward.
