Array area	The offshore wind farm area, within which the wind turbine generators, array cables, platform interconnector cable, offshore substation platform(s) and/or offshore converter platform will be located.
Bentley Road improvement works	Works involving the widening and improvement of the carriageway along Bentley Road, required to facilitate heavy goods vehicle and abnormal indivisible load access to the onshore cable route and the onshore substation.
Landfall	The location where the offshore export cables come ashore at Kirby Brook.

7 Technical Consultation

7.1 Introduction

- 1. This chapter of the Environmental Statement (ES) outlines the approach taken to consultation relating to the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) (hereafter referred to as 'technical consultation') for the North Falls Offshore Wind Farm (hereafter 'North Falls' or 'the Project'). Further details on the consultation undertaken to inform the Project's EIA, feedback received and the Applicant's response to feedback is presented in each relevant chapter in this ES.
- 2. Consultation in relation to the EIA includes statutory consultation on the Scoping Report and Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) (see Section 7.3) and non-statutory consultation (e.g. through the Evidence Plan Process (EPP), see Section 7.3.2).
- 3. The Applicant has had regard to feedback from the technical consultation and where appropriate used it to inform the design of North Falls and the scope of the impact assessment.
- In addition to the technical consultation, the Applicant has consulted local communities and landowners. Further information on all aspects of the North Falls consultation is provided in the Consultation Report (Document Reference: 4.1), which is accompanies with the Project's Development Consent Order (DCO) application.

7.2 Legislation, policy and guidance

5. As detailed in Chapter 3 Policy and Legislative Context (Volume 3.1) of the ES, the Project is defined under Part 3, Section 15(3) of the Planning Act 2008 as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP). The Applicant has therefore undertaken pre-application consultation in accordance with the requirements of the Planning Act 2008, the Infrastructure Planning (Applications, Prescribed Forms and Procedures) Regulations 2009 (herein known as 'the APFP Regulations') and the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (herein known as 'the EIA Regulations').

7.2.1 The Planning Act

6. A summary of the relevant Sections of Part 5, Chapter 2 of the Planning Act 2008 are outlined in Table 7.1.

7.2.2 The Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009

7. The Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 ('the APFP Regulations') set out the information to be included in the DCO application and provide details for how parts of the preapplication consultation must be carried out. The APFP Regulations also includes the list of prescribed consultees. The Consultation Report (Document Reference: 4.1) provides details of the Applicant's compliance with these Regulations.

7.2.3 National Policy Statements

- 8. The assessment of potential impacts upon Chapter 7 Technical Consultation has been made with specific reference to the relevant legislation and guidance, of which the principal policy documents with respect to Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects (NSIPs) are the National Policy Statements (NPS). Those relevant to the Project are:
 - EN-1 Overarching NPS for Energy (DESNZ, 2023a);
 - EN-3 Renewable Energy Infrastructure (DESNZ, 2023b); and
 - EN-5 Electricity Networks, which covers the electrical infrastructure in conjunction with EN-1 (DESNZ, 2023c).

7.2.4 EIA Regulations

- 9. The EIA Regulations set out a process by which statutory stakeholders are to be notified about the intention to submit a planning application and be consulted on the information to be provided in the ES. It places a duty on these stakeholders to enter into consultation with the Applicant and to provide any environmental information they hold that is relevant to the preparation of the ES. The EIA Regulations also make provisions for the local community to be informed and consulted about the EIA development.
- 10. For the Project, the relevant sections of the EIA Regulations relating to preapplication consultation are:
 - Regulation 8(1)(b) Notify the Secretary of State in writing that the applicant proposes to provide an ES;
 - Regulation 10 Application for a Scoping Opinion;
 - Regulation 11- Procedure to facilitate preparation of ES;
 - Regulation 12 Consultation statement requirements including in relation to PEIR;
 - Regulation 13 Pre-application publicity under section 48 (duty to publicise); and
 - Regulation 32 Development with significant transboundary effects.

7.2.5 Planning Inspectorate Advice Notes

- 11. The Planning Inspectorate has published a series of advice notes in relation to NSIPs. The advice notes are non-statutory but provide advice and information on a range of issues arising throughout the whole life of the application process.
- 12. The Applicant's approach to consultation has been informed by a range of the Planning Inspectorate's Advice Notes, with particular reference to:
 - Advice Note Three: EIA Consultation and Notification (Planning Inspectorate, 2017)¹;
 - Advice Note Seven: Environmental Impact Assessment: Preliminary Environmental Information, Screening and Scoping (Planning Inspectorate, 2020a);
 - Advice Note Ten: Habitat Regulations Assessment relevant to Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects (Planning Inspectorate, 2022); and
 - Advice Note Twelve: Transboundary Impacts and Process (Planning Inspectorate, 2020b)
 - Advice Note Fourteen: Compiling the Consultation Report (Planning Inspectorate, 2021a).

7.3 Approach to technical consultation on the EIA

7.3.1 Statutory technical consultation

7.3.1.1 Scoping

- 13. Regulation 10(1) of the EIA Regulations allows the Applicant to request a written opinion (the Scoping Opinion) from the Planning Inspectorate (on behalf of the Secretary of State), regarding the scope and level of detail of the information proposed to be provided in the ES.
- 14. A request for a Scoping Opinion was submitted to the Planning Inspectorate in July 2021, accompanied by the North Falls Scoping Report (Royal HaskoningDHV, 2021) which outlined the Project as it was understood at that time and described the likely significant effects to be assessed as part of the EIA, as well as the methodology for these assessments.
- 15. A Scoping Opinion (Document Reference: 7.25) was received in August 2021. The Scoping Opinion collated and considered comments from consultees and provided the Planning Inspector's opinion on what could be scoped in or out of the EIA.
- 16. Where impacts have been scoped in, as detailed in the Scoping Opinion, these are presented within each relevant technical chapter (Chapters 8 to 34, Volume 3.1).

¹ Consultation was undertaken under the 2017 version of Advice Note Three. There has since been an updated version issued in May 2024, however due to the time in which consultation begun, the 2017 note remains the key version for consultation on the Project.

17. A response to comments from the Scoping Opinion is provided within the relevant chapters of this ES.

7.3.1.2 Preliminary Environmental Information

- 18. A PEIR was prepared in accordance with Regulation 12 of the EIA Regulations, which requires the Applicant to publicise and consult on preliminary environmental information.
- 19. Preliminary environmental information is information compiled by the Applicant which is reasonably required for consultation bodies to develop an informed view of the likely significant effects of the relevant project, including any associated development.
- 20. A consultation period of 60 days was offered by the Applicant, from 16 May to 14 July 2023, which exceeded the statutory requirement of 28 days.
- 21. Responses to the relevant comments received during the PEIR consultation period are provided within the relevant chapters of this ES.

7.3.1.2.1 Targeted consultation

- 22. In addition to the PEIR consultation, a separate targeted consultation exercise was conducted between 14 March and 22 April 2024 (a consultation period of 40 days).
- 23. This exercise focused on changes to the onshore PEIR boundary made since PEIR, including areas for the Project's National Grid connection point, access, temporary construction compounds, amendments to the cable route and Bentley Road improvement works.
- 24. A PEIR addendum was prepared which assessed the likely significant effects of these amendments.
- 25. Responses to the relevant comments received during the targeted consultation period are provided within the relevant chapters of this ES.

7.3.2 Non-statutory technical consultation

7.3.2.1 Pre-scoping consultation

26. The Applicant proactively engaged with key stakeholders from an early stage in the Project, in relation to site selection and survey planning. Details of this early consultation is provided in Table 7.2. Further information regarding each meeting / consultation activity is provided in the relevant chapter of the ES.

7.3.3 The Evidence Plan Process

7.3.3.1 Overview of Evidence Plan Process

- 28. In order to ensure that the Project is subject to full and open consultation during the EIA process, targeted engagement with regulators and interested stakeholders is undertaken through the EPP and its associated ETGs.
- 29. The EPP is a mechanism to help agree the information to be supplied to the Planning Inspectorate as part of the DCO application for the Project to ensure compliance with the EIA Regulations, the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017 and the Conservation of Offshore Marine Habitats and Species Regulations 2017.
- 30. The EPP aims to assist all parties in the process during the evolution of the proposed DCO application, by:
 - Giving greater certainty to all parties on the amount and range of evidence to be presented within the application;
 - Providing structure and efficiency to discussion and sequential identification of key environmental and consenting issues;
 - Enabling time and resource requirements to be planned and optimised for all parties;
 - Helping address and agree issues earlier in the pre-application stage where
 possible so that robust, streamlined decisions can be taken and additional
 data can be collected as required; and
 - Providing a platform to debate advice on one topic between multiple agencies / stakeholders.
- 31. The EPP is a non-statutory, voluntary process and there are no legal obligations associated with it. It does not replace or duplicate existing requirements, the plans are formulated to fit with the DCO application process, including the statutory pre-application consultation processes.
- 32. The EPP is a framework within which statutory consultees and the Applicant ensure that the HRA process and agreed elements of the EIA process are completed in a way that is satisfactory to all parties involved. It is comprised of topic and issue-specific ETGs, which bring together relevant technical experts from each organisation in order to ensure that key issues can be discussed and where possible resolved as part of a collaborative process.

7.3.3.2 North Falls Evidence Plan Process

33. The ETGs which have been convened to date are shown in Table 7.4 below. These groups are designed to streamline the process and ensure that the most relevant technical experts from each organisation are represented on the ETGs and attend ETG meetings.
