My name is Caroline Jones, and I am a chartered town planner and planning inspector. I have been appointed by the Secretary of State to be the lead member of the panel to examine this application. I'm just going to ask my other panel members to introduce themselves today.

The meeting today is going to follow the agenda published on the national infrastructure planning website on the 27th of June 2023. So it would be helpful if you had a copy of this in front of you. Today's hearing is being undertaken virtually and that means that everybody is participating through Microsoft Teams. Can I just ask for those who are participating today if you could just make sure that you stay muted during the hearing just to minimize any background noise. The reason we're holding this hearing is because the applicants change requests invoked the infrastructure planning compulsory acquisition regulations 2010, which we will now refer to as the CAA regulations. When this occurs, regulation 14 Two of the CA regulation states that where we've already held issue specific hearings, we must arrange another and notify each additional affected person or interested party. Therefore the purpose of arranging today's hearing is for any additional affected person or interested party, as a result of the applicants change requests to make an oral representation on the matters that were previously discussed. At Issue specific hearings want to fall. It's not our intention to hear any new submissions today from existing interested parties who were invited and did have the opportunity to attend those hearings. All submissions made at those hearings and subsequent submissions made in writing, including those submitted at deadline nine have been and will be carefully considered. I'm now just going to move on to ask those of you who are participating in today's meeting to introduce yourselves. When I come to you could you just introduce yourself stating your name and who you represent? If you're not representing anybody, please confirm your name and summarize your interest in the application It would also be helpful if you could let us know how you wish should be addressed today. Could I start with the applicant, please?
