Oaklands Farm Solar Limited: Update on proposals for specific stakeholders – minor changes in the vicinity of the National Grid Drakelow Substation

Oaklands Farm Solar Limited ("the Applicant") intends to develop a large-scale solar farm plus energy storage facility, known as Oaklands Farm Solar Park ("the Project"). Oaklands Farm Solar Limited is a wholly owned subsidiary of BayWa r.e. UK Ltd.

The Project will be located on land west of the village of Rosliston, and east of Walton on Trent. The current proposals comprise a solar farm plus energy storage covering approximately 410 acres, connected to the national electricity network by a new underground cable.

As the expected generating capacity of the Project is over 50MW the Project is a nationally significant infrastructure project as defined by Section 15(3) of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) ("the 2008 Act"). The applicant is required to make an application to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO"). If the DCO application is accepted, the Planning Inspectorate will then process and examine the application and then make a recommendation to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero. The final decision on the DCO application will be made by the Secretary of State.

The DCO application will contain full details of the Project and will be accompanied by an Environmental Statement in accordance with the 2008 Act and the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017.

Update on the Project and targeted consultation

Statutory consultation on the proposals was undertaken between 21st April and 6th June 2022. That was followed by a targeted non-statutory consultation between 9th March and 21st April 2023 to give stakeholders the opportunity to comment on a number of changes to the proposals since the first statutory consultation.

Since then the Applicant has been reviewing the responses received and preparing the application and during the course of that work some further changes have been made to the Project. Those changes are minor and do not extend the order limits outside those which formed the basis of the original statutory consultation. We are not therefore undertaking any further formal consultation regarding the proposals. However, we did want to contact stakeholders with an interest in land in the vicinity of specific changes, to inform you of those updates and to provide the opportunity for comment ahead of the application being submitted.

The specific changes are:

- The use of the existing National Grid Drakelow Substation access from Walton Road for the
 purposes of intermittent vehicle movements during the lifetime of the project for the purpose of
 maintaining the grid connection point within the substation;
- The creation of an access into the land to the north of Walton Road beside the Drakelow substation, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and decommissioning the underground electrical cable running from the solar farm into the Drakelow substation;



 The improvement of an existing farm access off Walton Road to provide an 'in only' construction access for HGVs and other construction traffic during the construction of the Project.

The enclosed plans illustrate the approach being taken by the Project, which include the accesses above.

All responses made during the earlier statutory and non-statutory consultation periods will continue to be taken into account as the Applicant finalises its DCO application and will also be reported to the Planning Inspectorate when the application is submitted.
