ISH2 will be a high level Hearing during which the ExA expects to hear principally from the Applicant in summarising their approach as well as providing updates and clarifying matters. Any other parties present, including the Relevant Planning Authorities, will be asked for their comments but questions of a more detailed and technical nature will be contained within the first written questions following receipt of Deadline 1 submissions.

A Change Application was received by the ExA on 25 August 2023. At the time of the issue of this Agenda the related plans and documents had not been published to the project webpage, but will be available to view as soon as possible. The ExA expects to publish its decision on whether to accept the Change Application with the Rule 8 letter shortly following the Hearings.

Guidance under the Planning Act 2008 and the Infrastructure Planning (Examination Procedure) Rules 2010 provides that it is for the ExA to probe, test and assess the evidence through direct questions of persons making oral representations at Hearings. Questioning at the Hearing will be led by the ExA. Cross questioning of a person giving evidence by another person will only be permitted if the ExA decides it is necessary to ensure representations are adequately tested or that an Interested Party has had a fair chance to puts its case.
