Dear Mr Borghart,

Thank you for your email. Apologies for the delay in our response.

The Developer (RWE) is responsible for preparing the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The Developer asked the Secretary of State to state in writing its opinion as to the scope and level of detail of the information to be provided in the Environmental Statement (known as the 'Scoping Opinion').

The <u>Scoping Opinion</u> for Dogger Bank South Offshore Wind Farms was adopted by the Planning Inspectorate (on behalf of the Secretary of State) in September 2022, following a statutory scoping notification and consultation exercise undertaken by the Planning Inspectorate.

A notification/consultation exercise was subsequently undertaken by the Planning Inspectorate (on behalf of the Secretary of State) in respect of its transboundary duties under Regulation 32 of the EIA Regulations 2017 and as a signatory to the Espoo and Aarhus conventions, with a letter issued by the Planning Inspectorate to the Netherlands (the contacts on the UNECE website) in February 2023. We received a response from the Netherlands confirming it wished to participate in the procedure under Regulation 32, which is published here.

The Developer is also required to consult various statutory bodies with responsibility for different aspects of the environment and take account of their views in the final Environmental Statement, which will form part of the evidence considered during the examination of the Proposed Development. The Planning Inspectorate's Advice Note 12 (Transboundary Impacts and Process)

(https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/legislation-and-advice/advice-notes/) advises Developers to undertake their own consultation with governmental divisions and interest groups within relevant EEA State(s) and/or other relevant states (those that are parties to the Espoo or Aarhus Conventions). Developers are advised to undertake such consultation to ensure that potential issues and concerns regarding transboundary effects are addressed, where possible, before the planning application is submitted. This helps avoid issues arising during the Examination stage. Therefore, if the Planning Inspectorate is of the view that a proposed project is likely to have a significant effect on the environment in an EEA State(s) and notifies/consults EEA States as part of the procedure under Regulation 32, in line with Advice Note 12 Developers may include those EEA States in their consultations. The Planning Act 2008 requires Developers to have regard to consultation responses.

In terms of getting involved with the Terms of Reference of the EIA, we would suggest that you contact the Developer directly (dbs@rwe.com) noting that they are responsible for preparing the EIA. The Developer's statutory consultation, including the presentation of the

Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) concluded in July 2023. However, we are aware that the Developer is currently undertaking an additional statutory consultation which concludes on 15th September 2023, with details available here: Localised Supplementary Statutory Consultation - Dogger Bank South - Statutory consultation.

The Developer has confirmed their current intention is to submit the application in Quarter 1 of 2024. If the application is accepted for examination, your State would have an opportunity to make representations on the application and its transboundary impacts. As the Netherlands has confirmed to the Planning Inspectorate it wishes to participate in the procedure under Regulation 32, you will be consulted on the application for the Proposed Development, including the Environmental Statement.

The Inspectorate's Advice Note 8 series provides further advice on the Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project process, including on how to register and become an 'interested party'.
