Technology is changing rapidly and now solar panels are being produced, which are almost as thin as tinfoil and can be used on roofs of buildings, which previously weren't strong enough to support solar structures.

What the government should now be doing, is encouraging every business every household, and every individual to ensure that solar panel technology is affordable for everyone on their homes, factories and industrial buildings. Other countries across the world are embracing the new technology, with examples of solar panels being installed on the roof of bicycle stores, the central reservation of roads and ensuring that all new builds include green technology.

I am extremely concerned by the information that I read in the newspapers and online about the production of the solar panels in China. According to the Office of National Statistics in 2022, they said :

The UK imported £138.3 million of vegetable oils and fats from Ukraine in 2021, dropping to £43.5 million in 2022 as a result of the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. Despite the shortfall being covered by increasing imports from Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany, the reduction in supply of vegetable oils and fats from Ukraine increased global prices in 2022, leading to higher imports in value terms".

This statement in itself justifies why we must continue to cultivate good agricultural growing land, to stay food secure. This solar farm must be refused. Let's hope common sense prevails!
