I live on the edge of the proposed Mallard Pass Solar Farm array location.

I am opposed to the project and think that permission should be denied.

The reasons I object are as follows:-

1. Loss of agricultural land at a time when we need to produce more of our own food

2. Loss of habitat and damage to the environment.

- Mitigation proposals are inadequate.
- A building project on this scale is inevitably destructive and disruptive

to wildlife - both animals + plants.

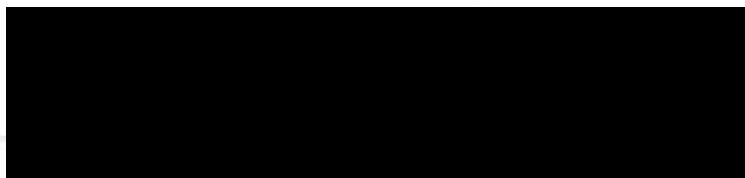
3. The supply chain for the solar panels has been traced and shown to have used Uighur forced labour which is utterly unacceptable.
