		The Applicant has not provided a copy of the dated letter with deadline for response date sent to local authorities to demonstrate compliance with s47(3). However, no comments disputing this matter were made by any of the local authorities in their AoC response received by the Planning Inspectorate. As such, the Inspectorate has no reason to conclude that the Applicant has not complied with this requirement.
		Annex 5.1.5B of the Consultation Report (Doc 5.1.5) provides the stakeholder responses received on the SoCC. The Annex states that the Applicant sent the draft SoCC to Boston Borough Council (BBC), South Holland District Council (SHDC) ('B Authority') and Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) ('C' authority). The commentary provided ahead of each of the summary of the comments received on the SoCC states that 'On Monday 8th August 2022, ODOW issued a Draft SoCC' followed by the date that the response was provided by each of the 'B' and 'C' authorities. The Applicant does not state whether a deadline was provided for responses to be provided.
		It is not clear whether East Lindsey District Council was consulted about the content of the SoCC. However, the Inspectorate notes that no concerns have been raised by East Lindsey in this regard as part of their Adequacy of Consultation response. As such, the Inspectorate is satisfied that 'B' and 'C' Authorities were consulted on the content of the SoCC.

Other Consents and Licenses (Doc 3.3)

The document does not include an introductory section explaining the purpose of the document which may be helpful to include.

Minor labelling and typographic errors

Minor labelling inconsistencies and typographical errors were noted in the following documents and examples listed:

Consultation Report (**Doc 5.1**) and **Annexes** – there are inconsistencies noted in the dates that s48 notices were published as shown in the table provided at 7.1 of the CR, and copies of the notices provided in Annex 5.1.6.

Environmental Statement Chapter 12 (Doc 6.1.12) - Table 12.78 states that cumulative effects from operational disturbance/ displacement on red-throated diver would be "confirmed following Population Viability Analysis post-PEIR". An assessment of cumulative effects on red-throated diver is subsequently provided at paragraphs 368 to 376; however, no reference is provided to PVA.

Environmental Statement Chapter 16 Aviation, Radar, Military and Communication Volume 1 (Doc 6.1.16) - there are instances of potential missing text or formatting errors within the document, e.g., 16.7.1.1 Impact 1: Creation of an Aviation Obstacle Environment (page 51): "From a starting point of no infrastructure within the array area, the infrastructure outlined in..."

Environmental Statement Chapter 20 Onshore Archaeology and Cultural Health (Doc 6.1.120) - there is missing text at paragraph 88 with regards to significance of effect for this receptor.

Environmental Statement Chapter 21 Onshore Ecology Volume 2 (Doc 6.2.21) - it is difficult to distinguish retained/reinstated habitats on Figures 21.1.2 to 21.1.6 due to the pale shading applied.

Environmental Statement Chapter 25: Land Use (**Doc 6.2.25**) - Land Use provides its figures in one file with a document reference of 6.2.25 but each figure within the document is also given its own document reference number (e.g. 6.2.25.1). The titles of the figures are labelled 25.1 and so on.

Environmental Statement Chapter 30 Human Health (Doc 6.1.30) - refers to an 'Appendix A', when appendices are numbered.

Environmental Statement Appendix 27 (Doc 6.3.27) - Annexes B, C, J, and K contain some presentational errors (e.g., tables have very small text and some are incomplete)

Flood Risk Assessment (FRA) (Doc 6.3.24.2) - the FRA indicates that the majority of the Site lies within Flood Zone (FZ) 3a, with small portions of the Site to the north and west located within FZ2. The EA's Flood Map for Planning for the Onshore Substation is included as Figure 24.3.6 and identifies FZ2 and FZ3; it does not distinguish land that is in FZ3a and 3b (if relevant). The FRA makes no mention of FZ3b and it is unclear whether any land within this zone is present.

Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA) (Doc 7.2 and 7.3) - It is noted that Table 2.1 within the HRA Screening Matrices (Doc 7.3) does not list all European sites that are subsequently included as individual screening matrices in this document, or those included in the HRA Screening Report (Doc 7.2), which are more numerous.

Cable Statement (**Doc 9.2**) - document reference 6.2.3.4 is referred to in Paragraph 14 of the Cable Statement but this document cannot be located and is unclear which document it should refer to.

8.20 Outline Vessels Management Plan (Doc 8.20) – the document reference included in the cover page is 8.2.
