Thanks for your email. Please see responses below in red:

1. Could you help me understand the definition of a 'relevant day'

'Relevant day' is set out in the Infrastructure Fees Regulations 2010 under Regulations 8 (Initial payment in respect of handling an application) and 9 (Final payment in respect of handling an application):

8(2) In this regulation—

"estimated relevant day" means a day estimated by the Examining authority as required for examining the application

9(3) In this regulation "relevant day" means a day on which the Examining authority examined the application, in the period beginning with the start day referred to in section 98(2) (timetable for examining, and reporting on, application) and ending with the completion of the examination

2. Could you help provide a guide as to how many 'relevant days' I should multiple the day rate for a typical Examination? Is it every working day over a period of 6 months?

<u>The Infrastructure Planning (Fees) Regulations 2010 guidance</u> gives further explanation of the definition of 'relevant days' in respect of the above regulations on pages 11 and 12:

- (iii) Regulation 8(2) defines "estimated relevant day" as a day estimated by the Examining Authority as required for examining the application. The fee will normally be expected to be charged for every working or "relevant" day in the period from the start of the examination until its end (normally excluding weekends and public holidays). There is discretion not to charge for certain days where there are good reasons to do so; any reduction in fees would be reflected in the final payment at the end of the examination (see commentary to regulation 9 below).
- (i) Under Regulation 9(3) (as substituted by the Infrastructure Planning (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 2013) a "relevant day" excludes weekends and public holidays, unless they are required for the handling of the examination, and any day on which consideration of the application is formally suspended (i.e. due to the review of the national policy statement, or the absence of adequate environmental information). There is also discretion not to charge for certain days where there are good reasons to do so e.g. where the inspector that is examining a single appointed inspector case falls ill and progress on the case is delayed. In such circumstances the number of "relevant days" counted can be reduced accordingly, thus reducing the final fee paid by the applicant

3. Assuming a 14th March submission date, when should we expect to make a payment for stages 2 and 3?

The Pre-Examination fee is requested once the Examining Authority has been appointed, which is done as soon as practicable after an application is accepted.

The Initial Examination Fee payment is requested as soon as practicable after the Preliminary Meeting has been held.

4. Have I missed out any other Examination fees?

Applicants are charged for:

- Applications for authorisation under sections 52 and 53 of the Planning Act 2008, obtaining information about interests in land and rights of entry
- Venue costs, where the Applicant does not provide a venue for a hearing
- A fee to accompany the application (the 'Acceptance fee')
- A Pre-examination fee following the appointment of the Inspector(s) initially chosen to examine the application
- An initial payment in respect of the handling of an application (payable at the beginning of the Examination stage, following the Preliminary Meeting)
- A final payment in respect of the handling of an application (payable on completion of the Examination stage)

Separate to fees, please also note that parties may be subject to Costs. When applications for Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects (NSIPs) are examined, some parties may incur significant costs when they take part in the process. The <u>Planning Act 2008: awards of costs - examinations of applications for development consent orders - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u> explains in detail how such an application for an award of costs will be treated, and gives examples of unreasonable behaviour. It also gives examples of good practice which will help avoid the risk of other parties obtaining an award.
